PRIDE OF THREE COUNTIES

Their Own Weapons and Uniforms 1816 Militia "A Motley Crew"

This is the second in a series of articles dealing with the history of the Lorne Scots, (Peel, Dufferin and Halton Regiment).

President Monroe declared war on Great Britain on June 17th, 1812, and preparation was made to invade Canada from Detroit, across the Niagara River to Montreal and Quebec. Major General Isaac Brock, Lt. Governor of Upper Canada, mobilized the local companies. A flank company of the second York Militia, raised in the Townships of Toronto, Trafalgar and Nelson, commanded by Capt. John Chisholm, served with General Brock at the capture of Detroit, and later at Queenston. "Push On Brock's last words," referred to Chisholm's Flank company which was, on the morning of the battle, stationed on the brow of the heights at Queenston. Capt. William Agnew's Flank Company from the 2nd York was also present at Queenston. The officers and men of these companies were granted land for this service. Later flank companies from the 2nd York Militia served at Stony Creek, Chippewa and at Landy's Lane. No medals were issued to the militia for service in any of these engagements, nor were battle honours awarded to the militia.

In 1816 the Gore District was established. It included other townships and the townships of Trafalgar, Nelson, Chippewa and Landy's Lane. The militia of the county of Halton, 4th of the county of York, and 10th of the county of Peel, were organized into three companies, each with a captain and three lieutenants. In the letter Mr. MacLaren said they (the YMCA-YWCA) would like to consult the various service clubs in Georgetown in order to organize it as well as possible."

A Senior Citizens' Club would provide group activities, outings and social get-togethers for the older residents.

The local Red Cross Branch did not provide the swimming instructors for the pool. However, indirectly, the Red Cross contributed to obtain and train the instructors. The instructors were selected by the Pool Director, Mr. Clifford Johnson, and hired and paid by the Georgetown Board of Parks.

The Canadian Red Cross Society gives free swimming instructors' and Leaders' Courses to interested persons. Passing of these courses is required to be qualified as a Red Cross Swimming Instructor or Leader.

The local Branch looked after certain expenses such as transportation and living expenses for the persons of Mr. and Mrs. Ted Johnson, who worked with the Red Cross courses at Golph and Toronto, Ontario.

The Branch also supplies Mr. and Mrs. Donald Galloway and Mrs. Jean Galloway and Mrs. J. H. Galloway with swimming literature, and of course, the swimming classes at the pool.
