He was taken to hospital by the Georgetown Volunteer Ambulance Service where he was treated for a broken hip, a broken elbow, a broken wrist, internal injuries, and a possible concussion.

Martin later told his wife from his hospital bed that he figures he could have escaped serious harm if he had had room to roll when he hit the ground.

He was operated on for five hours Saturday as doctors repaired his hip and wrist.

This broken elbow was set on Tuesday.

Martin said the doctor told her he would be unable to work for a year.
