
A three-year project by district resident Pierre Descamp started successfully Sunday when the plane he constructed himself took test flights at Guelph airport.

BUILD IT YOURSELF




See Under Water With Glass and Plywood Box

Penetrate the water surface with wood sealing all joints with any good caulking compound. Attach the bottom edge of the box projecting just far enough to make a recess into which the glass and felt gasket will fit attach pieces of 1" x 2" lumber to water activities. Use it from her as shown. Saturate the felt wharf or boat or simply by glass with waterproof bedding bending over while standing in compound. Fit it and glass into the recess and hold in firmly.

The viewer is a simple 4 x 4 box with the bottom battens. Paint box 24" long with glass on the top and finish all wood headed in one end. Make the wia a wood sealer and varnish box of waterproof glue fire proof oil or paint.
