


Judge watches John Wilson ...

It was the second year n succession that John, son of Mr. and Mrs. Spencer Wilson, had won the county Junfor title. They competed: in the Under 21 Class against other district plaughers. Ken Robinson and Don Brander, both of Norval, to the Under 16 Glass, Brian Marshall of R.R.4. Milton was the winner. and the first girl to contest the title in five years. Verna Thompson of Burlington, was second. They deleated Ron Brander of Norval, and Jim Dales, the youngest ploughman in the match at 12 Judge Ray Monahue showered the competitors with compli ments . . .
