Do Best Now
To do your best in your future job, you must do your best now. Make the most of your schooling. Take advantage of every opportunity that presents itself. Learn all you can in school. You will find that, at some time during your working life you will use all you have learned. The further you advance in your working life the more you will need your education.

I am not suggesting that a university education is for every boy and girl. However, I do believe that every student should get as much education as he or she is capable of mastering. Young people who leave school before obtaining as much education as they are capable of acquiring are in effect giving themselves a voluntary pay cut for the rest of their working lives. Statistics prove that by the time a man who has a high school education reaches his peak earning period he is earning 112.00 per cent more than the man who dropped out of school. According to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, each year of high school adds \$238 a year to your income for the rest of one's earning lifetime and the matriculation year alone adds \$466 a year, again for the rest of one's earning lifetime.

Increase Earnings
On this basis the value of a high school education (four years) over a grade school education in terms of 45 years or what might be called lifetime earnings is about \$42,000 and completion of your matriculation year alone increases your earnings by more than \$20,000.

Based on this information it is obvious that a decision to leave school too soon will affect your standard of living for the rest of your life. Therefore, it is not a decision you should make in haste. If in doubt talk it over with your parents, your guidance counsellor and the educational counsellor at your National Employment Office. Education is achievement. It is smart to stay in school.
