THE THREE CANDIDATES for the vacant Halton County seat in the provincial House are in a competitive race as they wait to be introduced to the electorate at Monday's meeting. The candidates are George Kerr, Conservative, William Gillies, NDP, and Owen Mullis, Liberal. The program was made possible by the Georgetown Junior Chamber of Commerce.

A two year term for the 1964 council came close to reality Tuesday when a 16-13 vote was cast when Mayor Hyde and Deputy Mayor Hunter and C. ONE WILL SUCCEED LATE STAN HALL AS M.P.P.

It was an old-time election meeting with a free-wheeling, law, not a promise, and that good natured crowd, Monday night when the three Halton County hopefuls took part in the Jaycees-sponsored "Meet Your Candidate Night..." Medicare government car insurance and equality of education were the three main planks of the New Democratic Party candidate, William Gillies. He told the roughly one hundred and twenty-five people present, that assessment could be equalized throughout the province, then a uniform tax rate for education adopted. This system would reveal how much each school area could yield in taxes. The gap between what they could yield, and the amount necessary for adequate educational services would be made by the province. The speaker assured the audience that this system has been in operation for years in four western provinces and Nova Scotia. The NDP propose car insurance with compensation regarding loss of fault, continued the speaker. "With the insurance sold with the car hence, there is a tremendous cut in promotional costs in fact" went on Mr. Gillies, "insurance premiums could be reduced one-third. Medicare for 60c a week per family was promised, with medical dental hospital, surgical and drug coverage. A 3% corporation tax, plus a 6% surcharge on income tax would finance the plan under the NDP programme. He took a few swings at the other parties, at Wintermeyer for his "Mafia hunt" and at Robarts, who can't get along with Mrs. LaMarche. He felt the province should step out of portable pensions, saying to be truly portable it has to be more than province-wide. As the bell rang to end his fifteen minutes, he urged a vote for the NDP is a vote to return the concept of government by the people and for the people to Ontario. "I will defend the record of the Robarts' government" he said. "My opponent, George Kerr, my opponent has no record to defend. I have consulted councils which have it and they are well satisfied with Mr. Gray. Mr. Emmerson said he had and trade were cited by his Conservative candidate as his main topics. The provincial government erasing the Ninth Line project for three years, but it took on the fact that four years ago costs still rise. He felt more direction from the province race. Mayor Hyde said C. Poy expanded technical and vocational school programme re-integrated into the provincial system, and the 9th Line not only as Georgetown's access to 401 but right to the lakeshore, similarly the Seventh. In addition he proposed the extension of Highway 25, serving Milton and Acton beyond Highway 5 to the lake. He denounced a vicious circle, the patchwork of provincial grants for education, and called a completely new approach to financing of education, one that would provide the same quality of education right across the province. "At the moment" he contended, "30% more money per pupil is available in the cities, than in rural areas, and public school boards get no less than 60% more per pupil than separate school boards." During the Question and Answer period which followed, the candidates displayed some nimble footwork and the audience a ready, good natured wit in their heckling, while Chairman Joe Gibbons displayed his usual aplomb and humour.
