Truck Forced Them Off Injured Men Tell Police

A truck forced them off the road causing \$250 damage to police car, two Brampton men injured in accident. Police said Chinguacousy Police last Friday after an accident four miles east of Georgetown.

The two men, Charles Cizamia, 30, 7 Centre St. N. and Leonard Wanke, 32, of the same address, said they were forced off the Fourth Line W. north of 5th Street, and down a 15 ft embankment.

Both men were taken to Peel Memorial Hospital for injuries suffered in the accident. Mr. Cizamia, the driver, suffered head and facial injuries and a possible fractured arm. Mr. Wanke was treated for head and shoulder injuries.

The truck allegedly involved in the accident has not been located, police said. No Star Tag was issued.

A two-car collision in Chinguacousy last week resulted in \$675 damage to both cars.

Chinguacousy, Ontario - Police said Alicia Burns, 34, Mr. Langford, Road N., was traveling south on the Hwy. 7 bypass near the First Line East, when her car collided with one driven by Jack Bambeau, 35, 108 McNeil St., who was traveling north.

Damages to Mr. Bambeau's car, a 1962 Lincoln, were estimated at \$450, while damage to the other car was \$225.

Police said no charges have yet been laid. PC Douglas Butler investigated the accident.
