Disappointed, But Lost to Good Man Says Mullin

It was pure bad luck when Owen Mullin, the defeated Liberal candidate, entered George A. Kerr's headquarters to congratulate the election and congratulate the winner.

This was at 9:20 p.m. and the vote at that time stood at Kerr 11,828, Mullin 7,468 and Gillies 2,825 with less than 100 polls left to report.

In concluding the successful Conservative candidate, Mr. Mullin said they both had fought a hard, but clean campaign.

"Naturally I am disappointed but I couldn't have lost to a better man than George Kerr," Mr. Mullin stated.

George Kerr issued a victory statement saying "There were many things that contributed to my election as member for Halton in the next provincial election. However it is the wonderful organization that nominated me that deserves the greatest praise. Their efforts throughout the campaign, especially during the last two weeks were tremendous."

Other factors he cited as contributing to the victory were the splendid and able leadership of the Hon. John Roberts,

Premier of Ontario. His clear quiet enunciation of the issues appealed to the people of Halton and Ontario.

He also gave credit to the record of the Conservative government during the past two years for returning them to power.

He said that no doubt the controversy over the pension plan had caused many people to support his party. This could be substantiated by the fact that John Wintermeyer, Liberal leader, had been defeated in his own riding of Waterloo North.

In concluding the victory speech Mr. Kerr said "Now that the voters of Halton have elected me their representative for the new legislature, I promise them they will receive a full time effort from me. I will do everything in my power to provide for the same high standard of representation they received from the late Stan Hall. There is much to be done and I am anxious to get on with it immediately."

Later in the night Mr. Kerr, wife, Acton, Georgetown and held a victory celebration in Milton.

Munday, the town clerk was instructed to contact Halton's new M.P. George Kerr and ask for an early meeting with the highway minister.

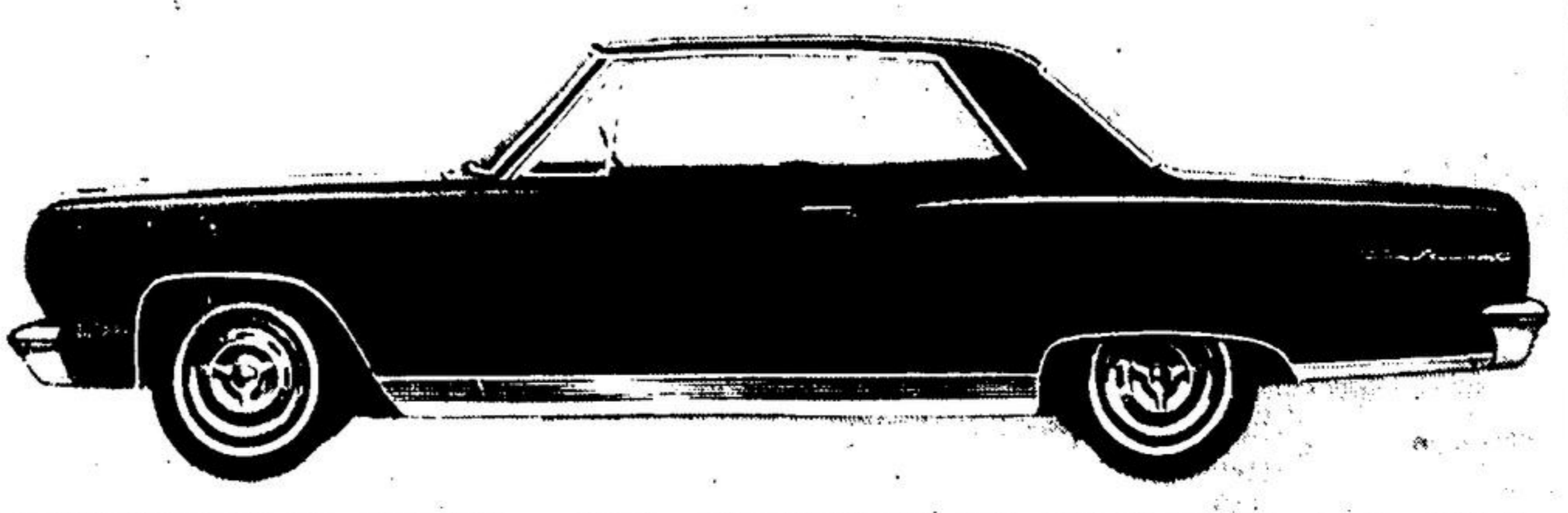
The town hopes to have the 9th line improved as a connecting link between 401 and Georgetown.

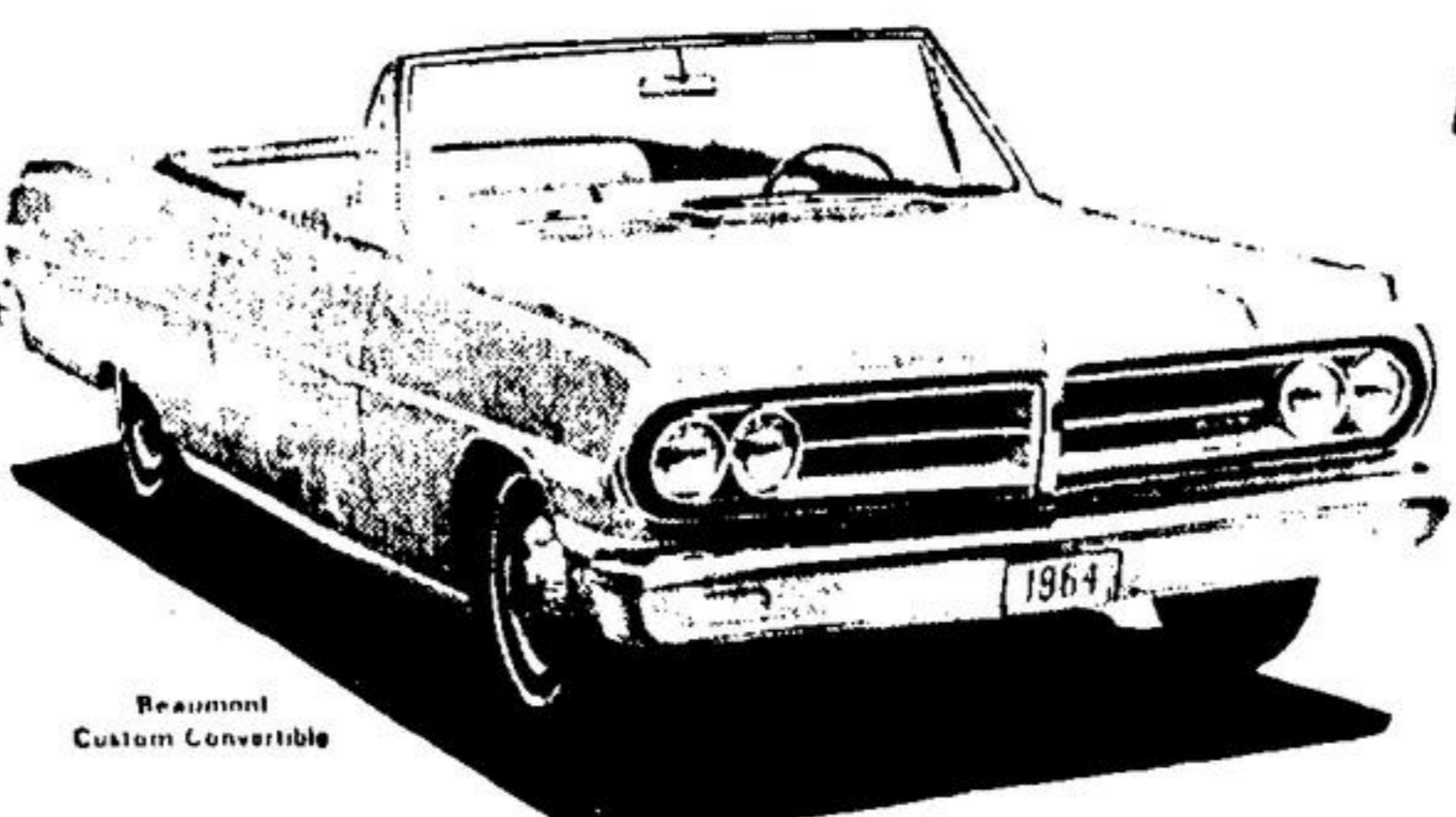
