The Corporation of the Town of Georgetown BY-LAW NO. 63-9

A By-Law to authorize the acquisition of Land and the Improving of Land where vehicles may be Parked.

WHEREAS pursuant to Section 377, Subsection 87 of the Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1960, bylaws may be passed by Councils for the purpose of acquiring lands, establishing, laying out and improving land where vehicles may be parked.

AND WHEREAS it is deemed advisable to acquire certain lands to establish, lay out and improve the same so that vehicles may be parked thereon, at an estimated capital cost of One Hundred and Twenty Thousand (\$120,000.00) Dollars.

NOW THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF GEORGETOWN ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the lands as shown in Schedule "A" attached hereto, which said Schedule "A" forms part of this by-law, be acquired by the Corporation of the Town of Georgetown to be used for the purpose of parking vehicles thereon.

2. That the said lands be acquired under the supervision of the Town Engineer.

3. That the Mayor and Clerk be authorized to enter into contracts for the purchase of the said lands on behalf of the Corporation, subject to the approval of this Council, to be declared by resolution.

4. That the said lands be laid out and improved in accordance with the discretion of and under the supervision of the Engineer of the Corporation, and that the said Engineer do forthwith make such plans, profiles and specifications, and for such work as may be necessary for the making of the contract for the execution of the said work.

5. That the work be carried out and executed under the superintendence and in accordance with the directions and order of such Engineer.

6. That the Mayor and Clerk be authorized to cause a contract for the construction of the work to be made and entered into with some person or persons, firm or corporation, subject to the approval of this Council, to be declared by resolution.

7. That the cost of the acquisition of the said lands together with the cost of the said work shall be levied against certain lands in the defined area of the municipality, as more particularly set out in Schedule "B" attached hereto, which said Schedule "B" forms part of this by-law.

8. The portion of the cost that shall be levied against each parcel of the lands as shown in Schedule "B" shall be in accordance with Schedule "C" attached hereto, which said Schedule "C" forms part of this by-law.

9. That upon completion of the said work debentures shall be issued to cover the cost of the acquisition of the said lands together with the cost of the said work.

10. That the debentures to be issued for the loan to be effected to pay for the cost of the acquisition of the said lands and the cost of the said work when completed, shall bear interest at such rate as the Council may determine and shall be made payable within fifteen years, on the instalment plan.

11. That the Mayor and Clerk are to arrange with The Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce for temporary advances from time to time to meet the cost of the acquisition of the said lands together with the cost of the said work pending completion of the same and the issue of debentures.

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THENCE North-easterly, along the said north-west limit of said Lot 13 to the north angle of said Lot 13.

THENCE South-easterly, along the north-east limit of said Lot 13 to the east angle of said Lot 13 being also the south angle of Lot 34 as shown on said Registered Plan Number 37.

THENCE North-easterly, along the south-east limit of said Lot 34 to its point of intersection with the south-west limit of Water Street in the said Town of Georgetown.

THENCE North-westerly, along the said south-west limit of Water Street to the north angle of Lot 36 as shown on said Registered Plan Number 37.

THENCE North-easterly, across Water Street to a point in the north-east limit of Water Street, said point being the south angle of lands formerly owned by Harley-Kay Limited and now owned by Mrs. William McNally of the said Town of Georgetown.

THENCE North-easterly, along the south-east limit of the said lands and its production north-easterly to intersect the westerly bank of Silver-Creek flowing through the said Town of Georgetown.

THENCE Northerly, along the said westerly bank of Silver-Creek following its various courses, to the point of intersection of the said westerly bank with the aforesaid south limit of Guelph Street in the said Town of Georgetown.

THENCE Westerly, along the said south limit of Guelph Street to the point of commencement.

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Board Disposes of Ligny, Quatre Bras

The future of two Esquimaux Township one-room schools was decided last week but sale of two others is pending further discussion with interested buyers.

Esquimaux school board members agreed to sell the Ligny School to Scotch Block W.I. for a community hall at a price of \$3000, and disposed of the Quatre Bras school to Mr. and Mrs. Frank Lendway for a residence at a price of \$5,010. Decision on the sale of Banockburn school to Arthur McLeod for a second-hand furniture store was withheld until the next meeting in two weeks' time.

Disposal of Pinegrove school is pending on a complete understanding by an interested group that purchase of the property can be made at the present time for \$2,500 of the school can be used for the period of a year after which teachers will be called again.

The one-room schools have been placed on the auction block after they were closed when Speyside, Limehouse and Pineview Central schools were built. Previously Blue Mountain and Limehouse one-room schools were sold. Horby school is still for sale as board members refused to accept tenders received.
