KNOW GAME LAWS?

It pays to know your game laws. Too often, hunters are not fully aware of the regulations governing the taking of game. Anglers, too, here are a few tips to help avoid violations.

1. Check your 1963 \$1 hunting licence. On its face you will notice that it is not valid in the Southern Region until September 20th.
2. The gun licence does not convey any authority to go on private land without the owner's permission. Good hunting relations are essential if you wish to retain a spot to hunt in the farming and semi-farming areas of this district.

3. Check your shotgun. Make sure it is plugged so that not more than three shells can be filled into the chamber and magazine combined at one time.
4. Don't attempt to shoot waterfowl from a power boat unless it is beached or within a blind.
5. Bait placed out to attract ducks must be cleaned out seven days before the opening date.

6. It is unlawful to shoot within a quarter mile of a baited area.

7. It is unlawful to drive ducks or geese by use of boat or motor vehicle.

8. Rifles are not permitted for the taking of ducks or geese.
9. The hunting of migratory game birds is not permitted before one-half hour before sunrise or after one-half hour after sunset.

10. No person shall place a flock of geese within a hundred yards of another flock of geese.

11. No person shall place a flock of ducks within a hundred yards of another flock of ducks.
