

If you change jobs, follow carefully the instructions on the back of the Certificate of Payment, Form 104, which your group is required to give you.

When you reach your 19th hirthday you are no longer covered by your parents' certificate. Register separately within thirty days to keep insured. Forms are available at hospitals, banks and Commission offices.

When you marry, the Family premium must be paid to cover husband, wife and cligible dependants. Tell your group OR, if you pay direct, tell the Commission.
