Lorne Scots Training Sheffield Park Camp

SHEFFIELD PARK TRAINING CAMP

The Lorne Scots Training Battalion under command of Lt. Col. T. E. Snow, Royal Canadian Regiment and Major R. W. Leut 21 C, assembled at Sheffield Park, East Surrey, England, and formed into six companies of 4 platoons each numbered 1 to 24 on 6th June 1942.

LORNE SCOTS (Peel, Dufferin and Halton Regiment) Canadian Army (Militia) 1946-1962

Over 900 all ranks marched into camp but with additional reinforcements over 1,250 all ranks were on strength at the end of the concentration.

A company was formed from 1st Army Defence Coy. under Capt. V. G. H. Phillips, officers: Capt. J. W. Brennan, Lt. T. Anderson, Lt. B. Cole, Lt. J. Robb, Lt. D. H. Andrews, and Lt. R. R. Kelly. B Coy was formed from 1st Can Coy Def Coy commanded by Maj. F. H. Chisholm with Capt. M. T. McApine, Lt. C. W. Darling, Lt. J. M. Conover, Lt. D. A. Ried, Lt. S. R. Charters, Lt. W. Burden and Lt. E. J. Lawrence. C Coy was formed from the 3 platoons of 1st Can Div commanded by Maj. E. G. Pullen with Major W. O. Stockdale, Lt. C. F. Richardson, Lt. S. T. Strathy, Lt. S. Beatty, Lt. C. D. Beatty and Lt. K. C. Campkin. D Coy was commanded by Maj. H. G. Praeger, with Capt. J. M. Burgess, Lt. E. W. Dault, Lt. P. B. Barber, Lt. E. J. Norris and Lt. R. H. Richards. E Coy was commanded by Maj. C. T. Sharpe, with Capt. W. Brett, Lt. C. W. Barlow, Lt. F. A. Tilton, Lt. V. K. Harshaw, and Lt. K. C. Cross, Major J. R. Barber, Lt. W. E. Ward, Lt. J. P. Plowman, Lt. E. J. Law, Lt. M. J. Gray were posted to companies. Also attached were Lt. J. R. Black, Lt. F. D. Gooderham, Lt. E. W. Ward, Lt. R. I. Goddard, Lt. C. W. Armstrong, Act. Capt. Leach, Lt. W. Lang and Lt. W. Leach. RSM Brown of the Scout Guards was attached as RSM. The training consisted of drill, marching, rifle practice, and country training. The hat in many different situations. Girl Guides

Gold Cord Highest Award in Guidedom

The All Round Cord is each badge of service in her school, by the accumulation of a charge of community and this required number of badges is done for a period of twelve months. The girl must be a first class for four months. The Gold Cord which is an achievement. The girl then carries out in itself. She must hold the Little House, Knit, and a badge of six badges which consists of each girl's initiative and her ability to post from which she must choose five badges.

A Guide who carries her All Round Cord acquires her knowledge and is expected to perform part of it to others in her Guide Company.

A Gold Cord Guide is expected to go out in wider field. A girl considered for the Gold Cord must be a credit to the Guide movement, both in and out of uniform.

The Gold Cord is awarded to a girl who holds the same badges as the All Round girl plus four badges for her Wonderful Emblem and her Campfire badge. She has to be an experienced camper. Her outdoor knowledge is an essential part of her training.

She must prove that she can put the knowledge that she has learned to practical use in the drill, marches, rifle practice, and country training. She must show her knowledge of and interest in her own country and is tested on her knowledge of Guiding. Personnel points of interest, customs etc were moved from unit to unit of her chosen country. She must prove herself capable of service in her school.

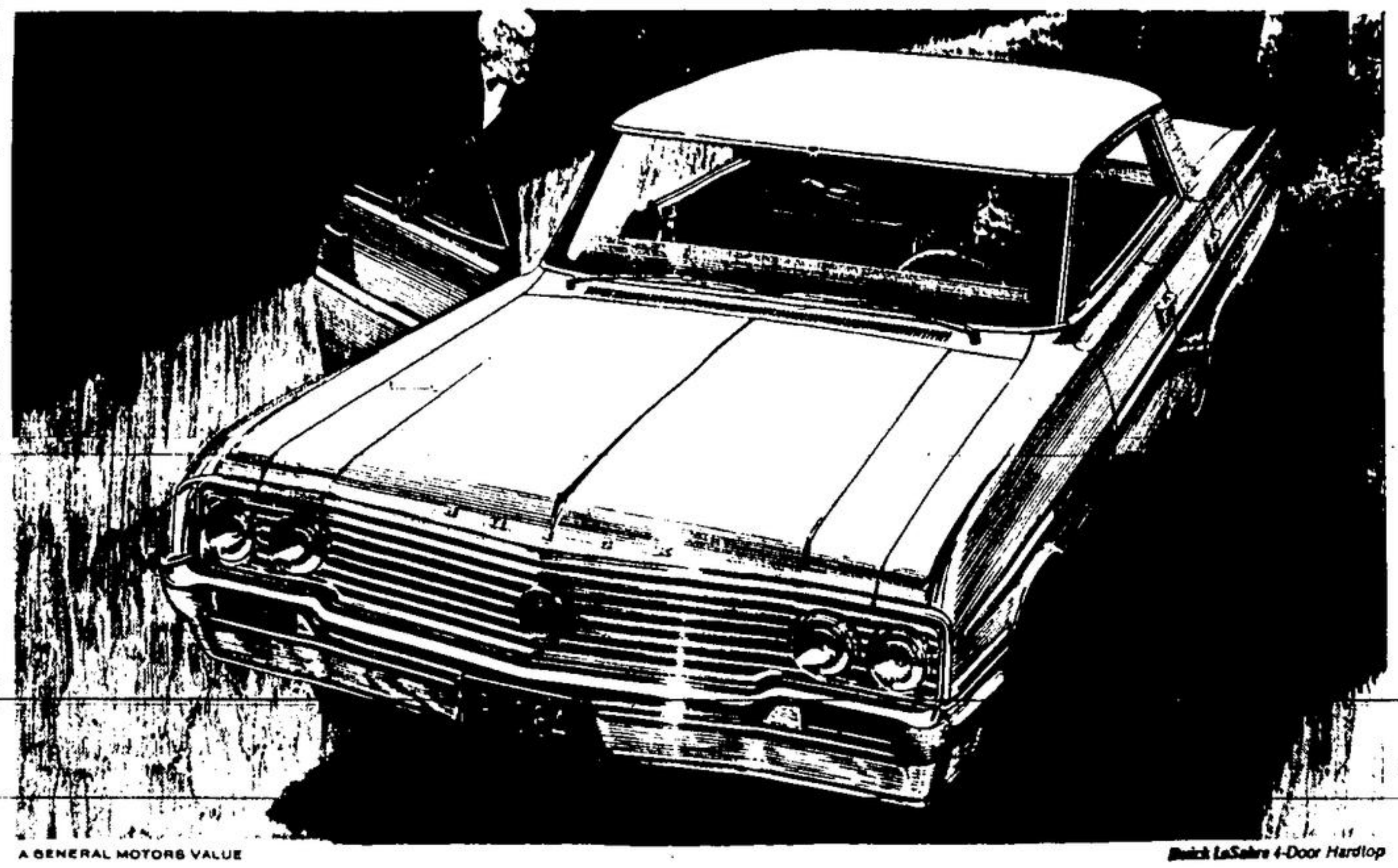
