Weekly Cattle Auction Planned at Georgetown

A 100-acre Georgetown farm scheme are about to establish has been taken over by a big monthly dairy calf sale and cattle operation with plans to give it a \$140,000 new look. It is the former Charles community auction sale success. Greig farm on RR 1. The sale was negotiated five weeks ago to Rockwood International, a firm with large-scale cattle dealing in the west. Plans are to completely modernize the farm and establish a weekly sales arena which will feature among the most modern in Canada.
