Men Outnumbered in Physical Fitness Classes

Are the women of Georgetown more interested in physical fitness than the men? It would seem so from the enrollment at the Night School Classes. The class for men has been cancelled due to lack of interest, while an extra class for women had to be added to accommodate the demand. Other classes originally scheduled, but now cancelled, are electricity, woodworking, merchandising, Grade 13 English, Chemistry, Jewellery, Basic English for French-speaking Canadians and Basic English for New Canadians. However, the Basic English for New Canadians could be reprinted if just a few more apply. A total of 296 adults will return to school to further their knowledge, or simply to enjoy themselves.
