**SPORTSMEN OUTDOORS**

At the next business meeting of the Georgetown Anglers and Hunters, the members in attendance will hear about this club's successful launching of their Hunter-Farmer relation program. Last Thursday night the club invited farmers from the surrounding area to attend a special film night. Nine farmers were in attendance when the films began. After viewing two films, "Gunning the Flyways" and "World in the Marsh," the guests and members participated in a questions-and-answers session. With the farmers and sportsmen firing the questions, two special guests were invited to supply the answers: Conservation Officers Bob Reid of Milton and Gurd Mathews of Guelph were the two guests under the guns, and escaped without even a scratch. The special night had two purposes; one being an opportunity for the farmers and the sportsmen to meet and discuss the many problems that are of interest to both. The other was an opportunity for the club to offer its services in its neighbourhoods. Tonight (Thursday) is one night again at the G.A.H.A. club house, and we're welcome to come. It was the opinion of many of the Outdoor Writers that the duck hunters should be ready to do some fast shooting when the ducks start to move. They expect the majority of the shooting to last only a few days because of the warm fall. It is expected that at the first cold snap, the majority of ducks will start their migration south in one flock. Large lake Rainbow run up the streams each fall and though spawning does not take place until the spring fresh from the clear lake water, the fish are bright silvery in color and do not take on the darker colouring with the rain-blow hues until they become acclimatized to the river water. During this period they are actively feeding and are usually in the mood to take an evening lure. Many fine specimens have already been reported taken by anglers and the catch should become more consistent through the remainder of October and November. A word of caution if you're thinking of fishing for fall Rainbow. All waters are not open to rainbow fishing before venturing out, check your regulations as to what waters are open until November 30th for Rainbow fishing. **Set Clinic For Hockey Officials, Learn Rules**

After consulting with the O.H.A., the Georgetown Referees' Association is making a sincere effort to eliminate the shortage of linesmen and referees and the inconsistency in officiating in town. Step number 1 will go into effect Sunday, November 3 at 1 o'clock sharp when a clinic will be held for anyone interested in officiating minor hockey, whether OMHA or Legion Saturday Morning Hockey, according to a spokesman for the G.R.A. Skates and a whistle are all the equipment required and it's not imperative that you bring a whistle. The first hour of the school will be spent on ice, practicing the physical part of the game. Later the officials will study the mental part of it, going through the rule book and clarifying the new regulations. "We feel possibly someone has moved into town and does not know whom to contact about refereeing," Bryan Lewis told The Herald. "Or people living here now may, for some reason want to break into officiating." Anyone who cannot attend but would like to officiate should call either Don Jarvie at 877-9630 or Bryan Lewis at 877-2468. Sunday the G.R.A. members met with the coaches and managers of the Support Group and went through the rule book with them in an effort to let the men who run the teams understand the reasons for, and the meanings of, new rules, and better understand the referee's job. They'll be repeating the whole thing for Saturday Morning Hockey Coaches and managers, and the players on the All-Star Midget team at the request of their manager.

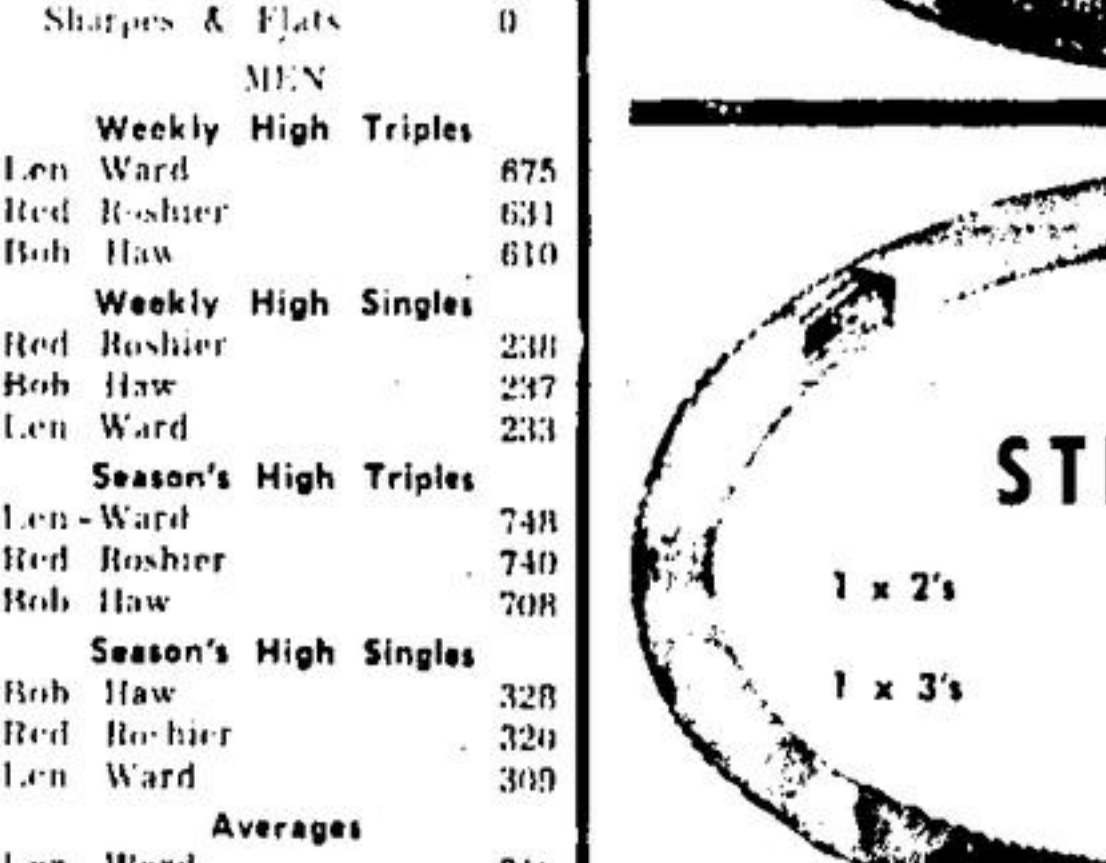
