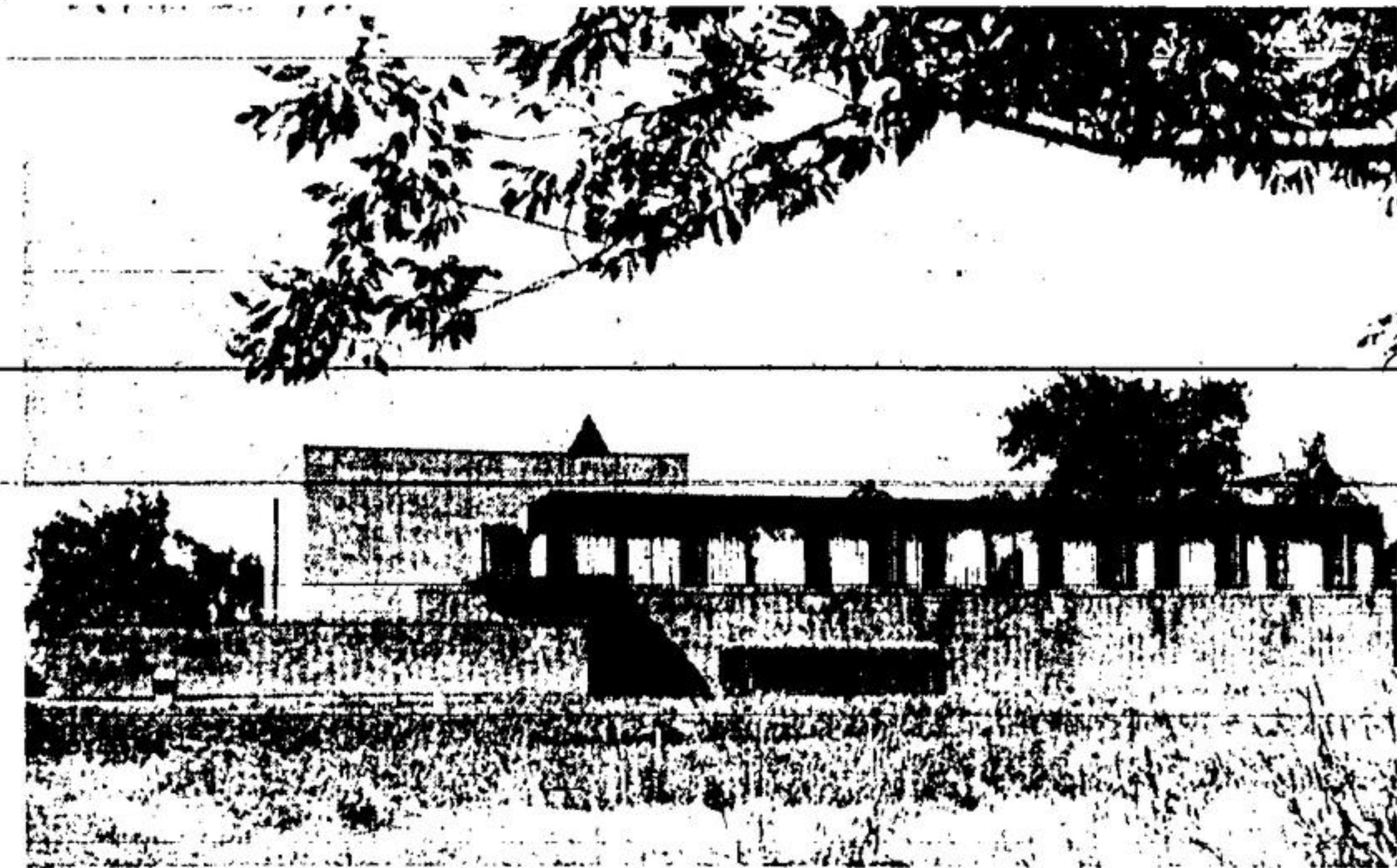
ALL OF THE CREDIT VALLEY watershed is the workshop of Stan White, new Field Officer for the Credit Valley Conservation Authority.
