**Halton Warden
To Get \$3500
Annual Salary**

A heated debate was conducted in County Council on Tuesday, Nov. 19th when the subject of the Warden's salary was discussed.

A by-law to fix the warden's salary at \$3000 a year with provisions for expenses was presented to council for their reading.

Reeve George Leitch of Esquimaux told council he checked various salaries for comparative basis and found that \$3600 was the average salary of county wardens.

He suggested council raise the salary to \$3500.

He pointed out that one third of this amount is for out-of-pocket expenses. He said that the money is received by the warden with the exception of mileage allowance.

Reeve Alex Phillips of Ononville said he found after he was warden that the day barely covered the annual warden's dinner.

"Out of a \$1000 bonus, I found that I received in those days the entire amount went to the dinner. Nowadays the warden has to entertain more than 100," he said.

A clause in the by-law stating the salary would be paid on a quarterly basis and that the warden is expected to present a quarterly report of his activities drew an objection from Deputy Reeve Bill Hunter of Georgetown.

"This quarterly report to be made by the warden means nothing. Who is to say that the warden was not in South Ansonia when he was supposed to attend various meetings?" he asked.

"I feel the warden should be given straight expenses. As the by-law now stands he can attend meetings or be on his way and it won't affect his salary."

Later a vote was taken to change a graduated scale of car mileage allowances. The by-law makes allowances of 30 cents a mile for the first 7000 miles, eight cents for the next 7000, and seven cents for the rest in excess of 14,000 miles.

Reeve H. H. Hinton of Atterton said he thought the mileage rate should be charged to a Halton rate for all members of council.
