Ability, Not Age, Might Be Figure Skating Judge

A new grading system which would provide more of an incentive to pupils, may come into effect in the Georgetown Figure Skating Club this season, it was disclosed this week.

The system, which would use the executive and introduce ribbons as a type of classification is being considered by the executive of the Georgetown club and it is believed it will meet with little opposition.

With the present system pupils are graduated on an age basis. For instance, pre-schoolers leave that group at Junior age, and Juniors stay in that group until 12, when they become Senior skaters.

With the ribbons system it would be more on ability than age. Skaters would be tested monthly and progress when they are able to stand up to each level of colour group. The steps would take them right up to the preliminary tests in the Canadian Figure Skating Association and from there it would be up to the skater.

Skating professional Ross Smith who teaches here has said he will cooperate with the club.
