**Tempo for Post Office Parcel Mailing Increases**

From Nome to Niagara this is the time of year when the tempo of Christmas begins to build pressure at the local post office.

**Find Body in Car Rule no Inquest**

No inquest will be held into the death of Herman Douglas Barr, found dead in his parked car on the Tenth Line of Esquesing, near 10 Sideroad, Tuesday morning, November 26th, according to Crown Attorney Peter McWilliams.  
The body was discovered by Chester Early, about 9:30 on Tuesday morning, when he was working in an adjoining field. The previous night, Mr. Early saw the car when he came home from nomination meeting, and seeing it still there the next morning, jumped the fence to investigate.  
He made a hurried retreat when he found the dead man, and rushed to phone the North Halton OPP. Const. Dave Richardson investigated.  
The '57 Oldsmobile had been seen parked there at 4:30 on the Monday afternoon by a neighbour.  
The 28-year-old Herman Barr lived at 350 Maple Grove Avenue, Cooksville. The possibility of foul play was ruled out earlier this week after an autopsy. Dr. J. H. Chamberlain of Georgetown was the coroner.
