## Injury-Ridden Beavers Drop Weston Game 7-2

Georgetown Beavers came out of their 2-0 lead with Weston Friday night looking physically and mentally exhausted.

The fact that Weston's 7-2 win made Georgetown the 1-1 club in Metro Junior B hockey seems Eastern and Western. Nothing for the club, however, but the physical beating was just as damaging.

Beavers lost their lead early in the first period with a pulled muscle and will possibly for the next four games. Other casualties were two of Beavers' best scorers, Pete Maxbury and Doug Sells. Both were unable to complete the game.

Beavers were in the lead for most of the 60 minutes, but as the 3rd period started, Weston's goalkeeping was superb.
