Georgetown-Flavoured Tanners Prove Too Good for Raiders

The Tanners were being called Georgetown Bs by some of the fans because of the heavy Georgetown flavour of their lineup. Paul Barber, Ron McLean, Max Stafford, Norm Lockhurst, Coach Junior Beaumont and sidelined for this game Bud Haines. Ron Malcolm was cut recently from Georgetown Junior B Beavers and another player, Hugo Bolzon is an ex-Raider.

The Tanners' boisterous entourage turned on the excitement as their club wrestled the lead away from the Raiders and gradually pulled away. Georgetown fans wore the look of losers after scanning the Raider club before the opening faceoff. Missing were Dave Irons, Bob Demers, Wayne Thompson, Nick Ferri, Wally Magdy and Pete Bradkin which included all of the Raiders who played Intermediate A OHA last year.

YEAR END CALLING

Anyone seeing the amount of parcels, letters and cards piled up in Post Offices this time of year can easily understand why the Post Office Department so strongly urges people to mail early for Christmas.

The Bell has a similar problem at Christmas, but no graphic way to show it. From seeing a Long Distance cable, it's impossible to tell that all the circuits in it are being used and that some customers are waiting to get their call through. Yet, at Christmas, this can unfortunately happen.

The reason is not hard to understand. Long Distance Lines are fully adequate to any normal day, when, in fact, hundreds of thousands of calls (mostly of a business nature) are carried. But, at Christmas, a FAMILY pattern of calling emerges all at once, with the result that a huge number of calls are made between towns that call one another only infrequently throughout the rest of the year.
