Government Approves Additions To Stewarttown, Glen Schools

A three room addition at Stewarttown School, and a two room addition at Glen Williams school have been approved by the Dept. of Education, it was revealed at Esquimaux School Board meeting Tuesday night. The addition at Stewarttown is conditional on the fitting of a larger water supply on the five acres adjacent to the school, on which the Board has taken an option.

The official opening of the Pineview School on January 29, will have the Minister of Education Wm. Davis as guest speaker. Prior to the opening the Board will entertain Mr. and Mrs. Davis at a dinner in Hawthorne Lodge.

"It will be a milestone," commented Trustee Mac Sprout, "since with the building of Pineview School, the day of the one room school" ended in Esquimaux.

A total of 754 pupils are transported daily to and from Esquimaux schools, according to Board member Bill Lawson. The eight buses travel 324 miles, at an average cost of 38.46¢ a mile, he stated. The average was taken over the period from September till December. Daily transportation costs are \$200 daily, upon which a grant of 51 per cent is received.

The erection of snow fencing at Limehouse, Speyside, and Norval schools will be investigated, in an attempt to prevent drifting over the playground and parking areas.

G. R. Muckart was awarded a contract to erect a double drinking fountain at Pineview school at a cost of \$218. The fountain will be built as soon as weather permits.

Mac Sprout reported complaints about children being kept waiting outside at Limehouse school from 8:15, the time of bus arrival, till 8:45 (one complaint in particular concerned a child with asthma). "It is the policy of the Board to let the children in, when it is cold," stated Mrs. Armstrong.

Wash and peel oranges and lemon. Wash and quarter apples, removing all seeds. Wash cranberries. Grind fruit together, including some orange and lemon peel. Add sugar to desired sweetness. Mix well. Refrigerate for at least one hour before serving.
