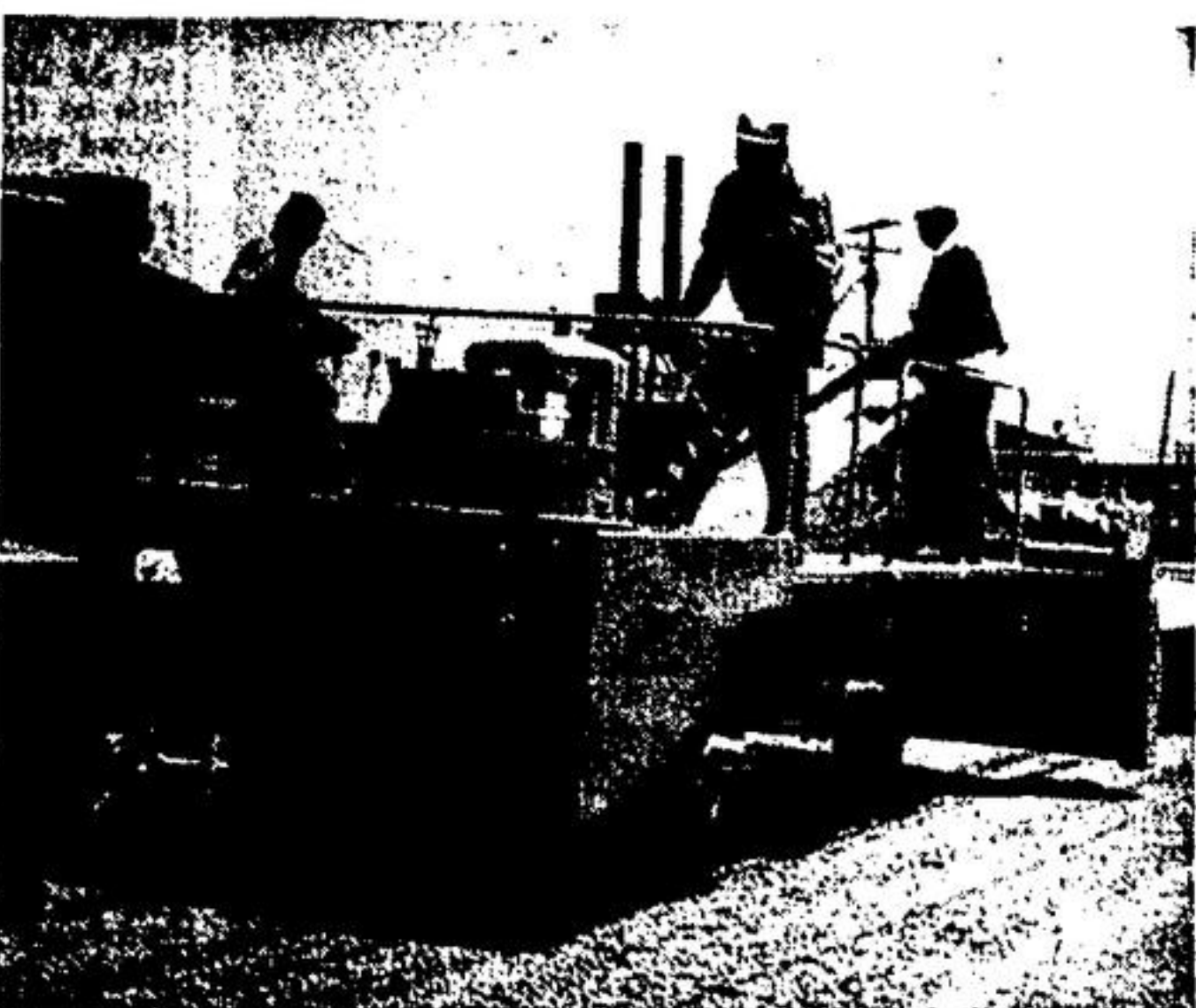


Townesley's "Hat Trick" Helps Acton Beat Raiders

Goalie, John Went, who was injured in the first period, remained in the twine for the second period, but was replaced by Rob Irons for the start of the third period and he played extremely well, allowing only two goals. Injuries, which have hurt Georgetown all year, continue as Murray Marchment was cut for four stitches and Wayne Watson injured his leg. This was one of the poorest games played all year. It lacked polished passing plays and finesse around the goal. With a healthy club and a lot of boosters, Beavers can only go one way and that's up.

Three "Sonny" Townesley scored three goals Friday night to carry Acton Tanners to a 5-3 win over Georgetown Raiders in a regular WOAA schedule game in pertumeburg. It was the second time in two meetings that the Tanners look the measure of the Georgetown intermediates. They meet two more times before the end of the regular schedule. Raiders failed to break through goalie Marshall's shield until late in the 2nd period but trailed after two frames 3-1. Each team scored twice in the third, Raiders pulling into a tie and then falling off the pace. Hugo Bolzon and Jim Casburn, a pair of hockey's senior citizens who can still skate with the possessors of younger legs, teamed up to push Raiders one goal back. Bolzon scored from Casburn at 8:57. Townesley jacked Tanners' up another notch when he beat J. D. Cameron from Bolzon and Marshall at 14:42 of the second. Bill Chard fed Dave Irons the pass that Little David converted into Raiders' first goal at 18:23. Townesley rebounded with his second tally to keep the two goal margin intact at 19:00. Casburn and Max Stafford assisted. Ross Cunningham's first goal as a Raider at 4:28 of the final session made it 3-2. Dave Irons and Finnigan were credited with assists. The tying marker finally came at 11:44 with the same trio involved. Irons was on the scoring end of the play this time with Finnigan and Cunningham helping out. Acton cracked the deadlock after just 11 seconds when Townesley completed his hat-trick without aid. Mellon contributed the insurance marked with less than two minutes to go on a pass from rearguard Stafford. Georgetown, after losing 8-4 to 4 Friday to Dixie, journeyed to Kingston and had another eight goals pumped behind them by a rugged Kingston crew. G. MacMillan opened the scoring at 12:18 and J. Mercer increased the lead in two at 19:24. Four goals were scored in the second period, all by Kingston players, Earl, Eaton, Percival and Lavalie, as the period ended 6 to 0. At 3:25 of the final period, Guy of Georgetown scored with Ron Lane and Murray Marchment assisting. G. Lavalie got his second goal of the night at 8:47 and G. MacMillan, who opened the scoring, closed it at the 13 minute mark. A total of 23 penalties were called, 9 to Georgetown and 14 to Kingston. Georgetown's
