Slippery Roads are Factor In Seven Holiday Accidents

Cars bumped, skidded and rammied up a total of \$2,650 in Georgetown during the holidays here in the past few days — but police are warning their teeth and waiting for the worst which usually accompanies the New Year's holidays.

Over the Christmas holiday period — from Dec. 20 to Dec. 26 — Georgetown police investigated 7 accidents with more than \$100,000 total property damage.

Road conditions were factors in many of the accidents.

At 5:25 p.m. on Dec. 20, the worst accident occurred on the worst road in town, Mount Road at River Drive. A 1967 Buick Wildcat was involved in a collision with a 1960 Buick Wildcat. The Buick was driven by Jim Bell, Glen Williams and a 1960 model car driven by H. C. Wilde, 71 Main St. N., hit head-on at slow speed when negotiating the John St. subway.

The taxi was entering the north end and the other vehicle the south end. A slippery road contributed to the accident.
