Survival Chance is 50% For Fatality Drivers

Halton drivers responsible for fatal accidents have about a 50 per cent chance of survival themselves. This statement was issued by Crown Attorney Peter McWilliams in the county court house last week.

Only about 40 per cent of the survivors ever come before a court for conviction and of this amount the figure of those who are jailed is almost insignificant, he said. Last year there were 27 fatal accidents in Halton. Of this total, 17 drivers proved to be responsible for the accidents — were killed themselves. Of the 10 remaining drivers, one driver was convicted this year of careless driving, one was acquitted and two have still to face the courts. The Crown hastens to add that it is often hard to pin point the blame when there has been a fatality and serious injury involving more than one driver. He said in the case of one accident in which two youngsters were killed at Stewart town, it is easy to point the accusatory finger at the driver. "But how can we be sure who or what was responsible for the accident when both the occupants of the car were killed and there were no survivors?"
