The orchid tours, which annually attract some 10,000 visitors to the greenhouses, on Highway 10, Brampton, feature displays of Dale's 17,000 orchid plants plus thousands of roses, lilies and gardenias. No matter how bitter the weather outdoors, inside it's a tropical 75 degrees.

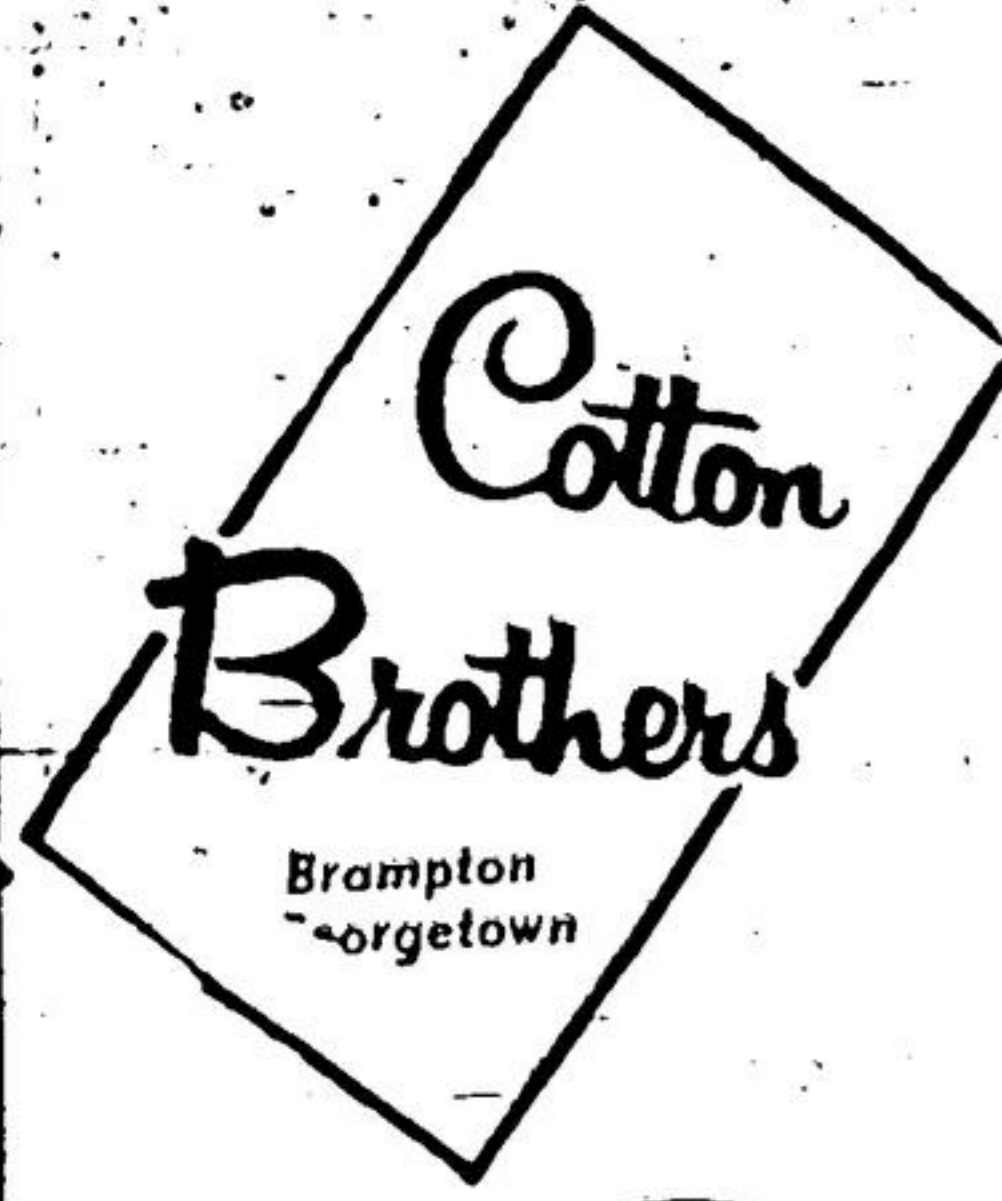

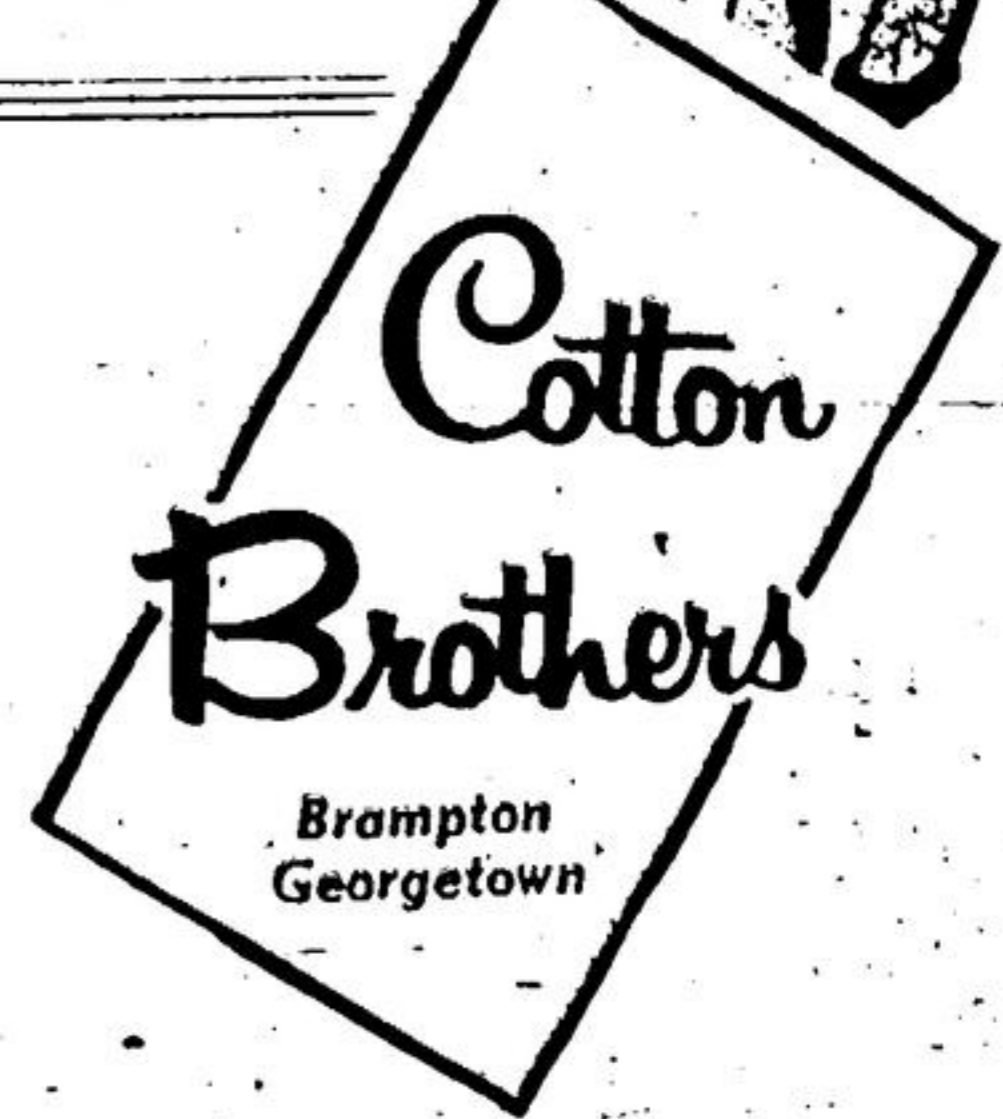
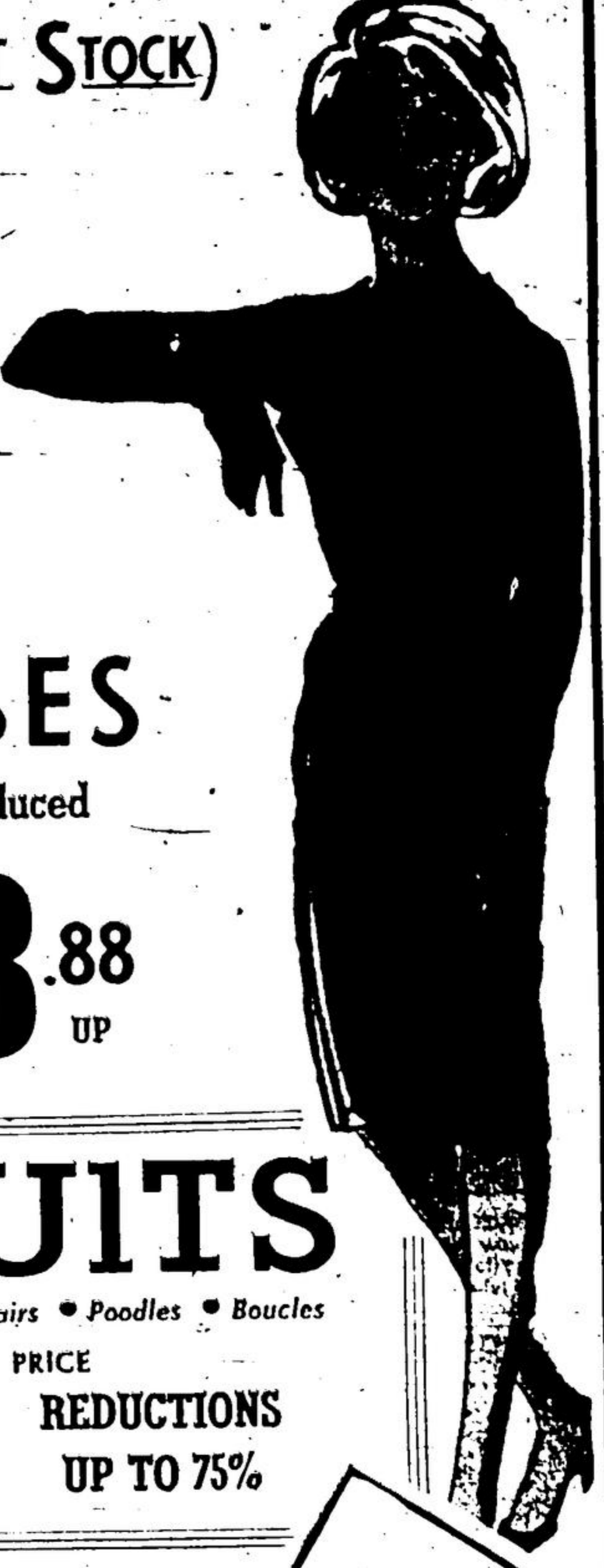
