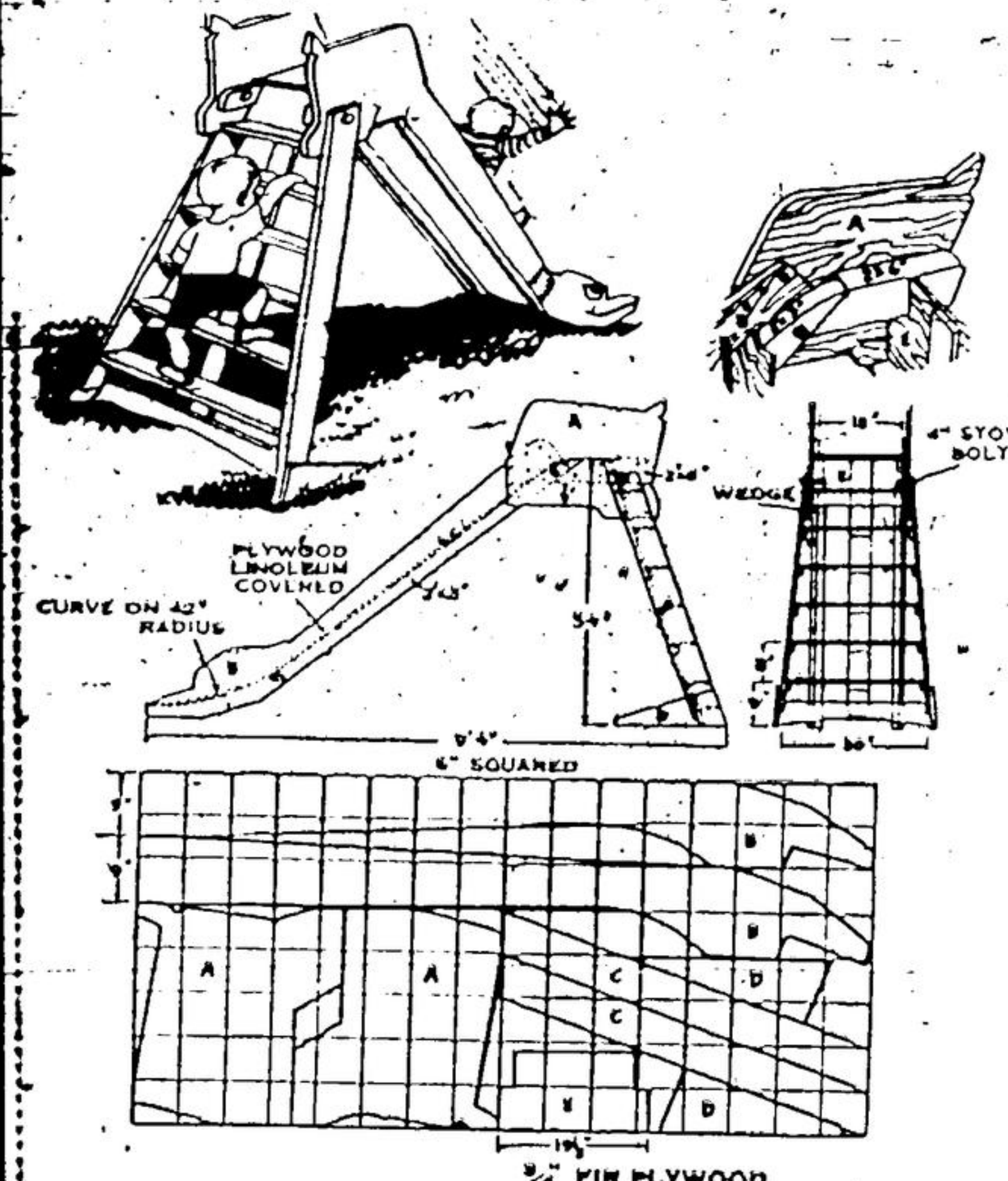
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### Here's a Winter Project for the Woodworkers

Here is a project for the advanced home workshop. Almost entirely cut with straight lines and bolted together it should be well within the weekend capabilities of a do-it-yourselfer. The wonderful thing about the bolt connection is that the whole rig can be taken apart for storage.

The cutout pattern makes the all edges and apply at least three coats of good exterior paint, preferably high gloss. When erecting on the lawn or play area it is wise to drive stakes into the ground to anchor the structure securely. It is essential to use water-proof glue for plywood because the glue will usually be stationed outdoors.
