**Guelph Couple Injured Flowers, Gardening
In Collision in Norval Were Hobbies of
Mrs. Kenneth Weston**

Two Guelph people were injured when a tractor-trailer and car tangled at Norval Tuesday night.
Admitted to Guelph General Hospital with a fractured jaw and fractured left wrist, Mrs. Elma Adderson of 64 University Ave., Guelph, the driver of the car (Clarence Adderson) suffered a bruised chest.
OPP said the collision occurred on No. 7 Highway opposite the White Horse station in the middle of Norval.
The tractor-trailer, owned by Harris Motorways, was driven by Wilfrid W. Wagg of Norval. Damage was estimated at \$800 to the front of the car, a 1959 Chevrolet, and about \$5 to the truck.

Two accidents occurred on the 5th Line of Esqueusing Saturday. In the first, Milan Lukovich of R. R. 1 Lamchouse escaped injury when his car, a 1960 Chevrolet Impala left the road and flipped over just north of the Check Line Dam. The car, a 1960 Chevrolet Impala, hood and fender totalled \$250.
Later the same day Douglas Robertson of R. R. 5 Milton, driving on the 5th Line, at 7:22 p.m., hit a cow owned by R. R. 2 farmer Georgetown farmer Neilson Stark.
The collision injured the cow's right hind leg. The 1957 Meteor Robertson was driving received \$45 damage.

A Georgetown man, Duncan Alex Tarzwell, 29 Arletta St., left his car unharmed after it hit a hydro pole at Norval Thursday, Feb. 13 causing \$600 damage to the front end and windshield. This one happened at 11:50 p.m.

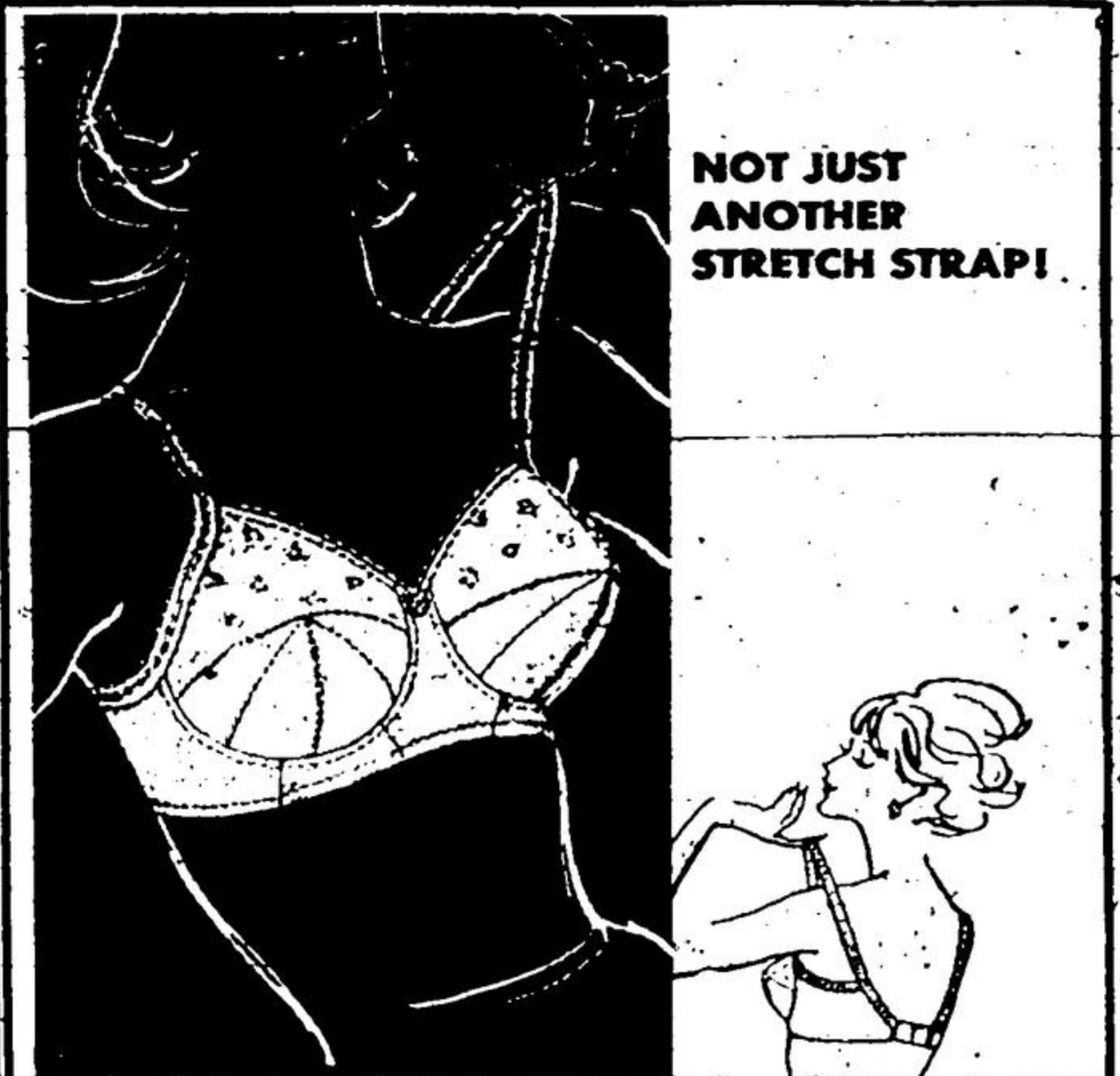
