SEAL-O-WAX STREAK SNAPPED BEAVERS BOW OUT WINNING

The last league scheduled game produced the Beavers' second victory of the campaign as they stopped Markham's 18-game unbeaten streak with a superlative 6-2 victory. Selby with two goals and one assist, the home team displaying sharp passing and accurate marksmanship, did not look like a last place club.
