**LET'S PLAY BRIDGE**

Here is a hand that caused one declarer some grief at the Action Bridge Club last week. Every South got to four hearts. Two made the contract and one went down. The hand does require careful play. Here it is. The dealer is West and both sides are vulnerable.

I feel that North has a reasonable opening bid. If some of you don't feel that North can open the bidding, then South should open fourth hand. You hearts can be reached easily if South opens the bidding. West had two good leads - either trump or the queen of clubs. Let's say that West leads a club and the defence takes the first two tricks in that suit. The defence should switch to trump, which South should win. The hand will not play well at a cross ruff. Declarer's trump are not solid enough for such a venture. The best idea is to set up diamonds. South leads a small diamond and if West takes the ace, the

defence is finished. Let's say that West ducks. South leads a small diamond from dummy and ruffs East's jack. Now a trump to dummy's ace and since the opponents' trumps are taken out, declarer is home free. The diamonds can be set up while there are sufficient entries in dummy with spade ruffs. If the opponents' trump had been split three-one, declarer would have had to give up a diamond trick in order to ensure the contract. I imagine the declarer that went down took out two rounds of trump before he tackled diamonds. Now, when the ace of diamonds is held up, declarer can get in trouble if he doesn't give up a diamond trick later on. He does not have sufficient entries to set up diamonds by ruffing.

**New Domestic Power Rates Favour Heavy Hydro Users**

Customers of Georgetown Hydro are being encouraged by the Commission of that utility to "live better electrically." Revised domestic retail electric power rates have now been put into effect. The new rates will benefit those who are average to heavy electric power users. According to the new schedule which has just been announced by chairman E. W. Binkley, there will be a minimum monthly bill of \$2, which permits the customer to use up to approximately 78 kilowatt-hours of electricity per month at no additional cost. The next 174 kilowatt-hours will cost 1.5c gross per kilowatt-hour. Customers having a Hydro-approved, controlled, metered water heater will benefit by obtaining a block of 500 kilowatt-hours per month at the low rate of 0.5c per kilowatt-hour. Where the customer has a Hydro-approved electric water heater with no control there is a block of 500 kilowatt-hours per month available at a rate of 0.7c per kilowatt-hour. All of the above rates are subject to a 10% discount for prompt payment. Chairman Binkley stated that a controlled electric water heater is one to which the electric current can be interrupted by means of a signal sent from the municipal Hydro control centre during a system peak. A non-controlled water heater is one which is not interrupted at any time. The local Hydro chairman explained the new rates by illustrating with an average Georgetown Hydro customer's bill.
