Eight New Congregations Constituted in Halton Area

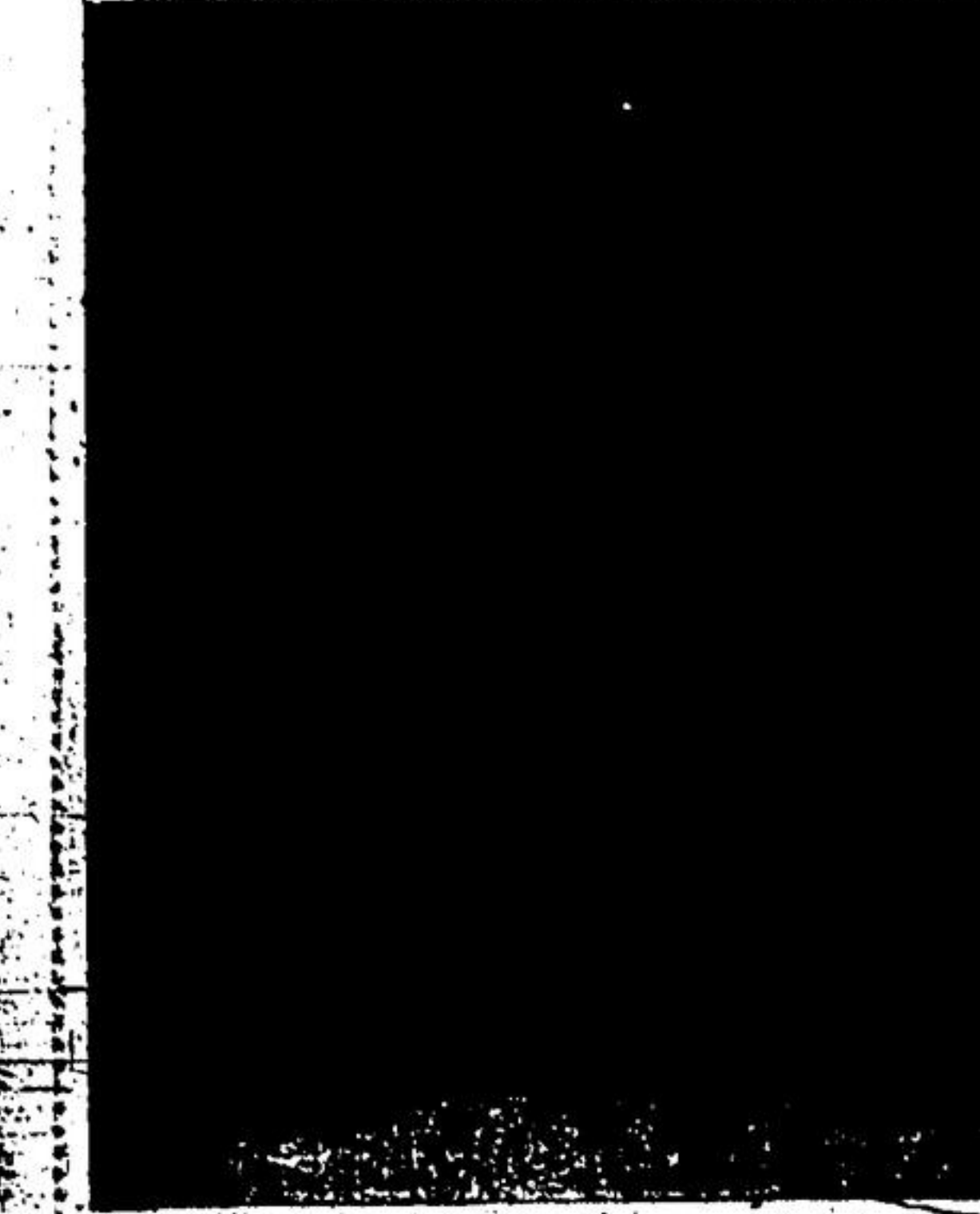
Since its inception in January 1955 the Halton United Church Extension Council has constituted eight new congregations it was announced at the annual banquet last week.
