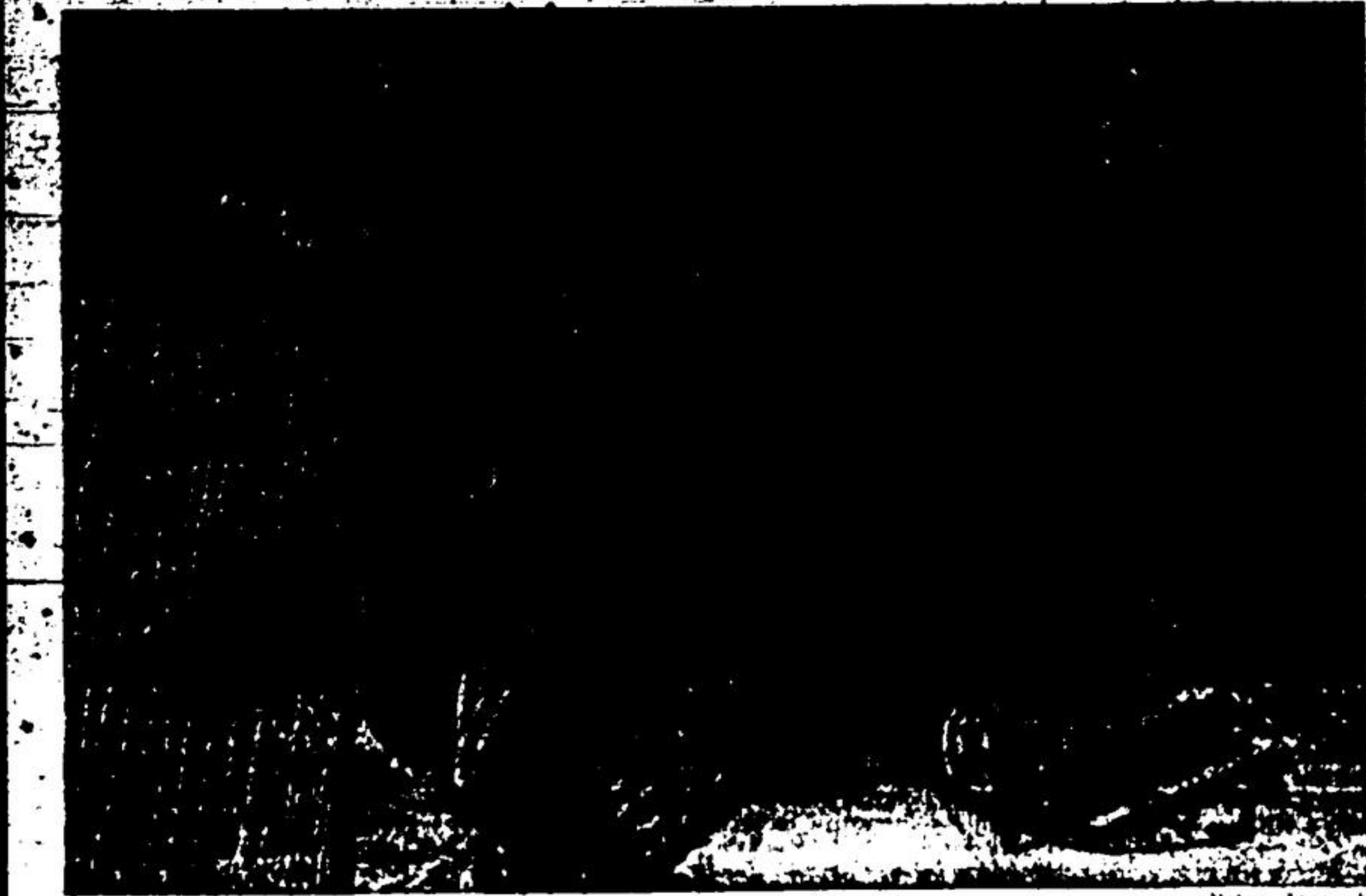

Raiders Tie Dufferins in Exciting Second Game

Subduing Orangeville Dufferins is like holding a Great Dane in a laundry basket. Raiders had the Duffs on ice at least three times Sunday afternoon in the second game of the best of five group semifinal but twice the defending league champions wriggled free. The third struggle finally stuck and Raiders contained them 7-5.

The win locked the series a game apiece. Most of the scoring action was packed into the second half of the third period when Orangeville dangled victory in front of the redirts and then snatched it away in teasing fashion. Georgetown carried a 2-1 lead into the final period but saw it erased early. They bludgeoned the Orangeville twice twice in two minutes and in a game where goals were obviously hard to come by the 4-2 margin looked sturdy. In another two minutes it wasn't there.

Raiders snapped the dead lock again with less than five minutes to go but an Orangeville thrust wiped that one out. Finally Georgetown snipers put together goals at 17:20 and 18:41. At this late stage the Dufferin resilience was too weak to produce one more bounce and they surrendered to Georgetown for the first time this season.

Irons started the scoring on an odd goal that trickled painfully past outstretched Waldo Watson into the Duff cage. Late in the first period Bill Bingham fooled Orange and three team mates expecting a pass by sliding a shot from just inside the blue line that found the bottom left corner. The only second period goal was Orangeville's, Church the triggerman, before most of the crowd of 400 had returned to their seats.

It was Little who notified Raiders they would have to score more for a win when he evaded the count after both clubs missed glowing chances. In the third, Bill Chard juggled the puck over three lines and passed to a cluster of players at the edge of the crease. T. Charlton golfed it into a gaping net to make it 3-2 with 12 minutes still to be faced.

Mike Finnigan finished a rush with his only goal two minutes later, vapping in Bud Varoy's centering pass and Georgetown looked safe with a 4-2 edge. Paul Courtney was left unchecked on J. D. Cameron's doorstep a minute later and Orangeville reduced the margin to a single goal. A bullet from Little who skirted the left defense and it was 4-3. The clock continued to pare off the precious seconds as Dave Irons rifled a shot from the boards to Watson's opposite side. The lanky netminder had trouble with it, managed to trap it against the post with his skate but couldn't hold it when Bud Varoy swooped through and rapped it home with the heel of his stick.
