Two in Hospital After Tobogganing Accident

A spontaneous tobogganing party ended abruptly Friday night when three Georgetown men were injured in two accidents on the North Halton Golf and Country Club hills. Still in hospital are lawyer Terry Baines, 3 Moultriey Cres. and Dave Baker, 6 Moultriey Cres. Both men suffered back injuries. A third member of the party Murray Henley, 30 Maple Ave. W., suffered bruises and a shaking up. He was X-rayed at Georgetown hospital and allowed to go home. Six couples went to the golf course to take advantage of the perfect night for tobogganing, but the party was over in less than half an hour. They decided to move to another hill after Hanley was injured on a run down the first fairway. The toboggan he was on shot off the edge of the road crossing the run and went high in the air for about 20 feet. On the first run down at the new location Baines and Baker went hurtling over a natural hump and landed heavily. Baines had to be transported to a car by toboggan. Baker made it most of the way on his feet with help.

Seek Municipal Advice on Employing Relatives

Three weeks ago, Georgetown council passed a resolution which would bar members of the immediate family of a sitting councillor from employment with the town. "Immediate family" was not defined at the time and on Monday, Mrs. Francis and Emerson moved to rescind the motion. With Cr. Bill Smith they had opposed the February move. This time mayor Gibbons sided with them, expressing his opinion that an opinion on the legality of the resolution should be obtained from the town solicitor. But the action was affirmed when the motion was lost on a 5-4 vote. "Vague, ambiguous and discriminating" Cr. Francis termed the move, pointing out that a relative of a councillor could not run for election without jeopardizing his job. He quoted a clause in the Municipal Act which he said makes the motion illegal. Cr. Emerson said he has been unable to find anything which would back such legislation and wants a ruling from the Municipal Board. Cr. Hildebrand said he voted for the motion because there is a danger that a sitting councillor might put a close relative in a job. "or the public might think he did, and we would not want to create this image." Cr. Powers said he believes another section of the Municipal Act, concerning conflict of interest, makes Georgetown's move legal.
