Dufferins Check Raiders Into The Brine Pipes

Checking like so many custom officials Orangeville Dufferins spoiled Raiders coming out party here Friday night. They won the 4th game of the best of 5 WOAA semi-final series 4-1 to knot the set at 2 games each. Dufferins stuck to their checks "like ugly on an ape" and the shadow job, was so effective Georgetown didn't get one good scoring chance in the sixty minutes. The only shot that beat Waldo Watson was a screened slider that fooled the janky Orangeville puck-eater. Most of the Raider shots were from well out. A crowd of over 700 watched the Dufferins out-dig the Raiders in the crucial battles for the puck in the corners and outskate them between the blue lines. There were no scoring bursts. Orangeville led 2-1 at the end of the first period then tightened their grip as the game progressed, notching a third goal in the middle period and a fourth late in the game. Grant Smith broke the scoreless tie halfway through the first period. Soloman started the play in the Dufferin zone and Pointer handed Smith the pass that the smaller half of the Cough Drop Brothers banged past J. D. Cameron's outstretched skate. Raiders were going about their too-frequent role of penalty killing when Jamie Cunningham pounced on an Orangeville mistake at centre, skated in the reversing defence and launched the ice hugging shot that Watson moved too late on. Little brought the strong Orangeville contingent to their feet with his goal that snapped the deadlock. Slightly more than two minutes were yet to play in the period. Paul Courtney and Church did the ground work for Little who shook a Raider defence player long enough to poke the puck the rest of the way home. A clean play produced Orangeville's third marker. Pointer layed a perfect pass for Soloman who gobbled it up near the Georgetown blueline in full flight and sized the shot by Cameron's glove side. Raider's well laid plans to erase the two goal difference in a hurry were scattered by Orangeville's timely fourth marker. Grant Smith triggered the shot after Soloman and Pointer spurred the rush at the five minute mark. From that point, Raiders could only make unthreatening stabs at the Dufferin cage. The windmill of Orangeville back-checking kept Raider pressure from flowing to Watson's doorstep. Most dangerous runs at the visitors' territory collapsed in the vicinity of the blueline. Though Georgetown lost the encounter, winger Mike Finigan won a skirmish with a delegation of holstered Duff backers. Michael and the customers traded blue paragraphs in the third period and it nettled the front row members of the visiting supporters so much the referee suggested they give up their ice-level seats for a loftier vantage point. The suggestion had an "or else" appended to it. When he wasn't playing checkers with the congregation the referee was distributing penalty box sentences. Georgetown was slapped with 9 of the 14 total.
