Need 574,000 Taxes For Public Schools

The public school board will ask for \$574,174.00 from county taxpayers. Finance chairman J. Minern said at a meeting of school trustees last Wednesday it will take that to operate Georgetown's five public schools this year.

The past couple of years the public school finance committee have hit the annual cost just about on the nose. This year, however, the Department of Education changed the system for arriving at the provincial grant and the board's unfamiliarity with the new method has hampered their budget computing.

The teachers' salaries schedule has been changed slightly to increase the maximum in category 2 by \$100. The schedule as it now stands is:

Category 1	— \$3,300.00 to \$5,100.00
Category 2	— \$3,700.00 to \$4,100.00
Category 3	— \$4,100.00 to \$6,800.00
Category 4	— \$4,500.00 to \$7,500.00

Principals responsibilities allotments were also upped. Principals will now get \$125 for the first ten rooms instead of \$100.
