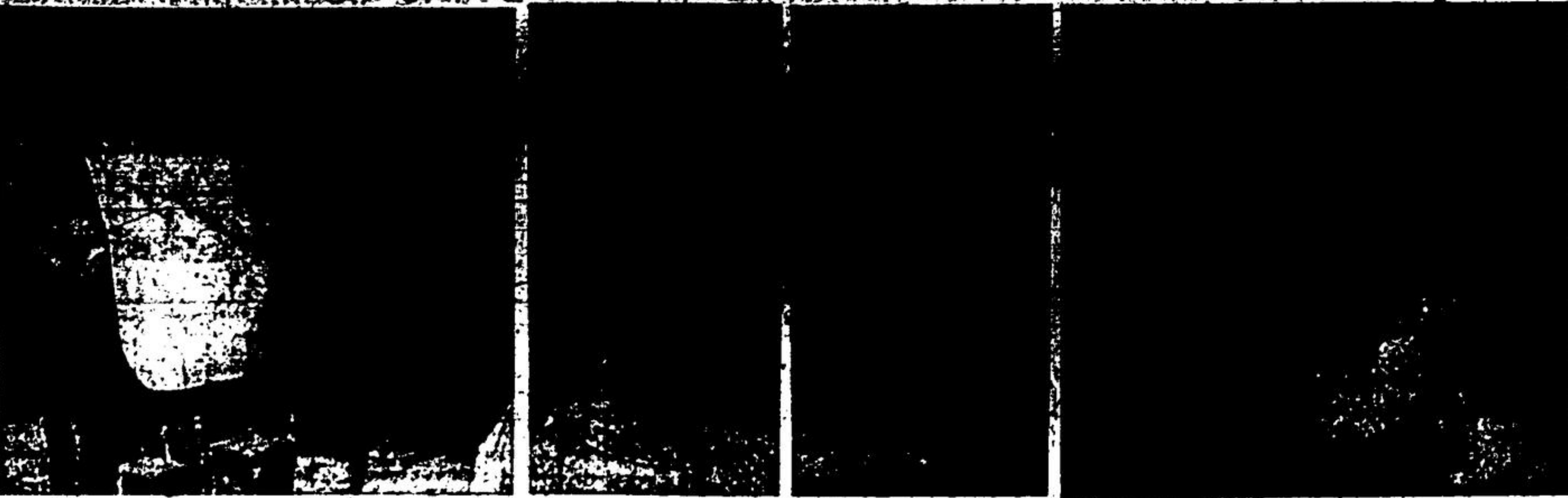


Hungry Hockey Horde, Perpetual Appetites, Big Job for Feeders

Passed originally on a 6-3 vote the veto found three councillors with changed opinions, and the rescinding motion also carried on a 6-3 vote. Mayor Gibbons and C. Powers and Hildebrandt joined the original opponents. C. Smith, Emerson and Francis is killing the legislation.

Complete Bantam Tournament Results to Press Time Wednesday

If you've never seen the combined expressions of complete exhaustion and complete delirium you can catch it on the faces of a small flock of Bantam hockey players about 7:45 Saturday night. That's about the time one of the 41 teams fighting for their hockey lives in the International Bantam Hockey Tournament were will have reached the peak by capturing the Grand Championship.

A number of clubs have already faced elimination, most of them D teams since that class drew the largest number of entries and Saturday was devoted entirely to Class D games.

Still in the running for the D crown at press time were Exeter, Hespler, Delhi and

Glanworth. The B series had been whittled down to Carson, Belleville, Galt and Woodstock, and the only remaining A teams were Toronto, Oakville, Kitchener and Winnipeg.

The C series in which Georgetown is playing was just getting under way when this went to press.

The D and B championships will be decided Friday night. The C and A finals are set for Saturday morning. The Grand Championship semi-finals start at 1 o'clock Saturday afternoon.

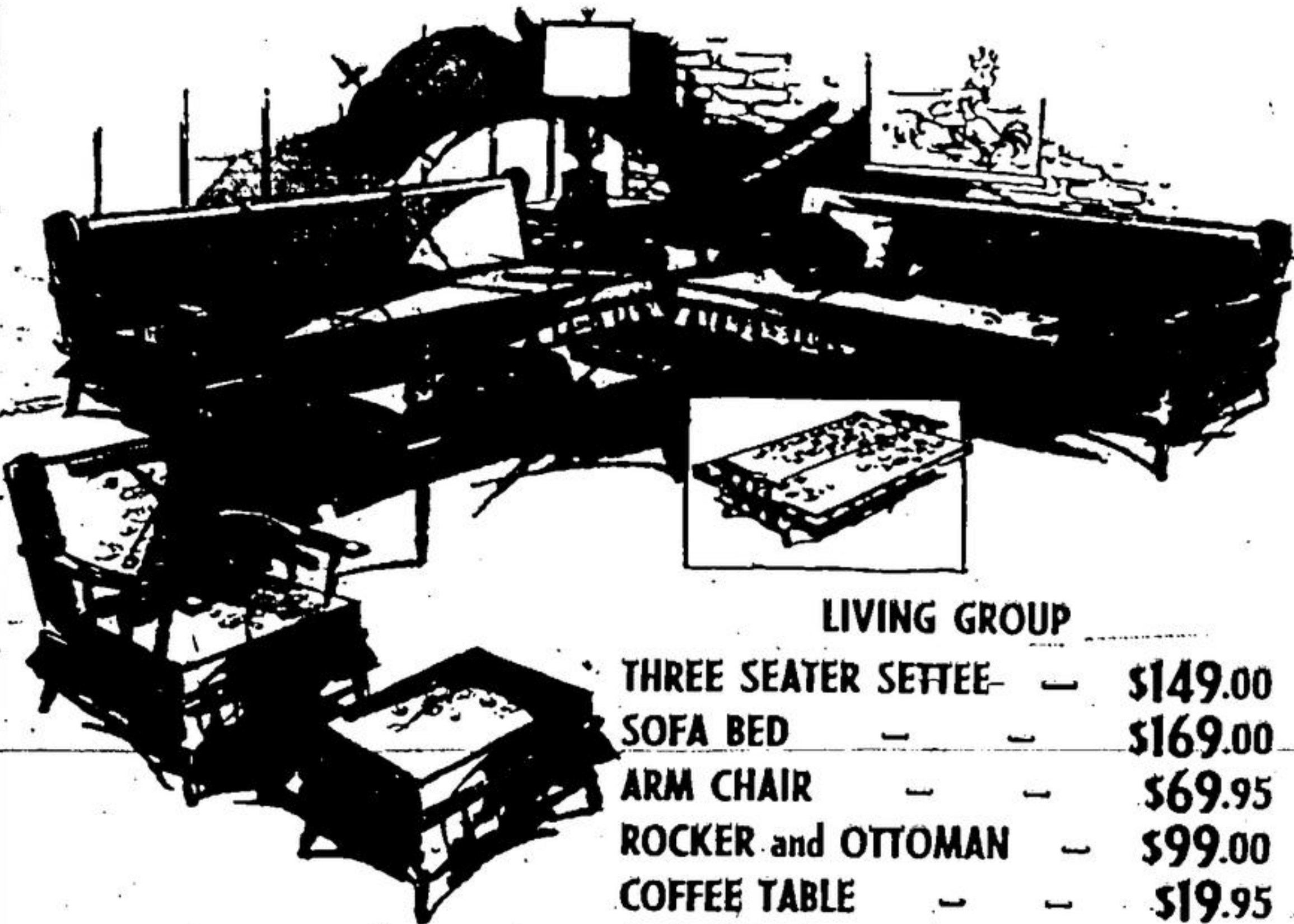
