If we can reach the happy state when family fouds can cease, when English and French Canadians stop dreaming up differences, when protestant catholics and roman catholics avoid bitterness, then Canada can lead the parade in racial integration. Unless we do, we give mainly lip service to an ideal which our heart is not prepared to face.
