Seventy-Two Year Old Man Seriously Injured In Crash

Condition of a Guelph man injured in an accident Saturday afternoon was termed yesterday by Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital officials as being "a very slight improvement."

George McQueen, 72, of 454 Woodlark St., Guelph, was seriously injured after the car he was driving left the road and struck a tree on Highway 7 north of 23 Sideroad (Limehouse sideroad).

The car, a 1965 Chev., was a total wreck. The investigating officer, Y. Dube, of the North Halton OPP detachment said McQueen was driving north on Highway 7 when the accident occurred. He said driving conditions at the time were "excellent."

McQueen is resting in a comfortable as possible with multiple fractures and several bruises.

Two hundred dollars was the total damage to cars driven by David Frederick West of Acton and Keith Lawrence Edwards of Weston when they collided on No. 7 Highway just east of the 3rd line of Esqueping. A third car, driven by Ignace Wal of Montreal, became later involved and received \$5000 damage.
