School Site or Legal Action Public School Board Threat

Legal action may end the tug-of-war between the public school board and council over a parcel of land in an unleased area of the Delrex subdivision.

The school board are adamant that the site they designated as the location of Georgetown's sixth public school is ideally situated. But council's feeling has been otherwise whenever the subject was broached in the past.

The school board felt they are using foresight in asking that school number six, which is needed now, go up in the centre of an area that will eventually be populated.

Council has indicated in initial discussions that they prefer the school be located close to a built-up area primarily because they don't anticipate release of more residential land for some time. Much of the parcel of land released in the

area has still to be built on, and it's unlikely council would okay development of another parcel until the residential-industrial balance is closer to what it should be.

At a school board meeting Wednesday April 1st, trustees favoured asking council formally for the property they want at the next council meeting with an ultimatum. If council's reply is positive again, the school board will turn the matter over to a legal firm they have been consulting for some time.

The trustees agreed to send a letter to council and appear at the same meeting at which it is read to make a verbal request for the site providing their ultimatum is agreeable.

One trustee stated flatly Wednesday that "the time for talking about it is over. The day when we'll need another school is getting pretty close."
