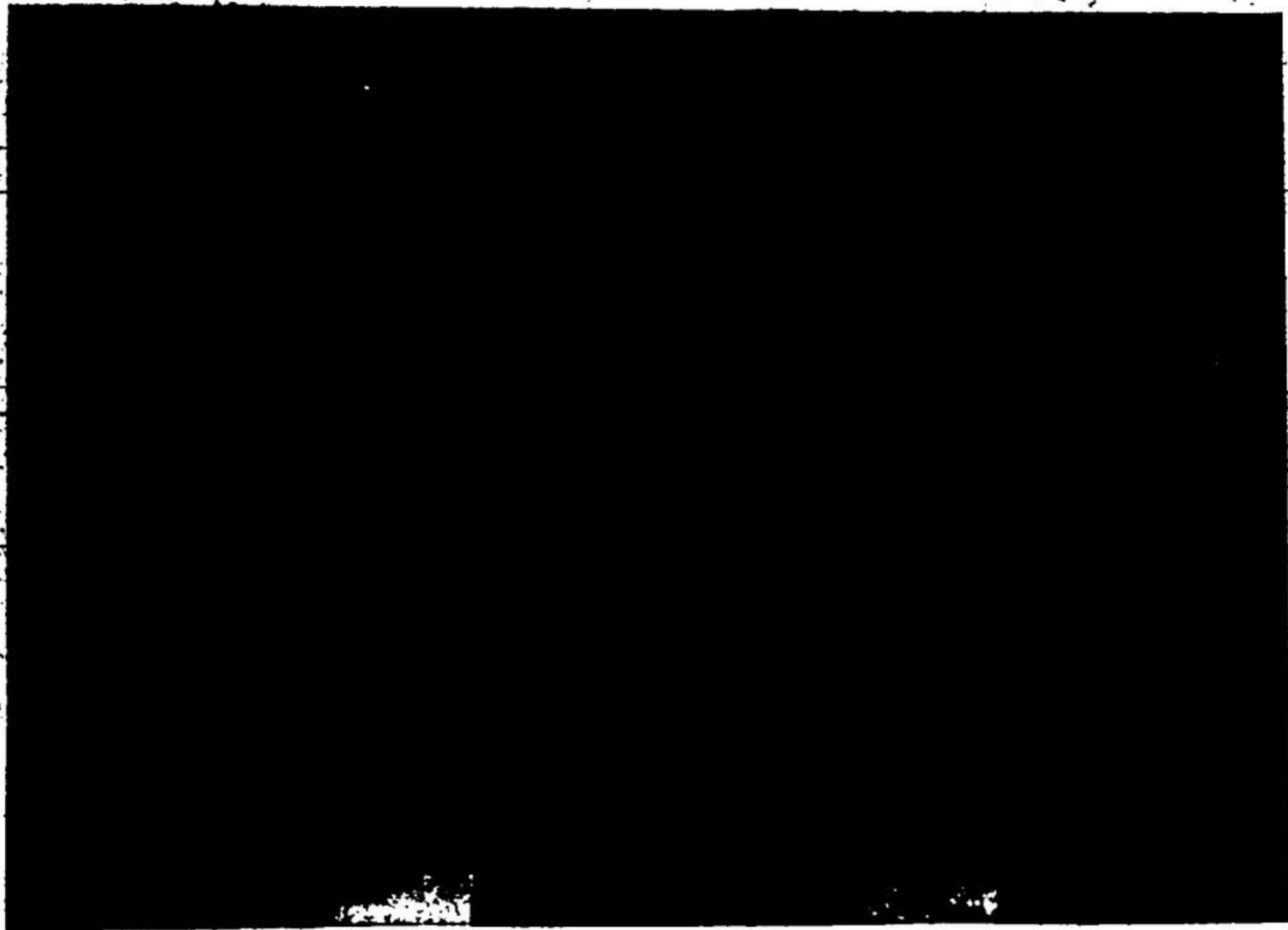


WIN THE SILVER SHIELD

The Treasurer's report showed that at the present time there was over \$1100 in the treasury with some bills yet to be paid before the year's expenses are cleared. This is the largest amount yet at the end of a curling season.

Burrell Quits Tri-County Richmond Possible Successor

Ever since its founding in December, 1957, the Tri-County Hockey Association has been built around its secretary, Bill Burrell.

At the annual meeting of the Association this April 25, he will submit his resignation. In a letter dated to the Association March 30, he officially states he is through at 2:00 p.m., Sunday, April 26.

Besides the position he has held with the Tri-County Association, he has also been the area representative for the Ontario Minor Hockey Association for the past year and sits on its executive.

He feels that he has fulfilled his duties for the Tri-County Association, but didn't do all he should have done for the OMHA.

Since there is only so many hours in a day, and he doesn't want to be unfair to both, he has been forced to discontinue his association with one of them.

For the past few years he has always said he would resign, but could never force himself to do it.

He has never gone as far as handing in his resignation before. "If it's for real this time, in the words of MOHA president Pete Mackie, 'he'll be a tough person to fill in for.'"

If he left, an election would be held at the general meeting to find a successor.

A possible successor is Bill Richmond, who last year was Georgetown's representative on the Tri-County executive; and a year before had helped Burrell.

Other than Burrell, the person who would know most about the number of hours he works for the association is his wife.

Although her husband had said nothing to her about definitely giving up the position as secretary, she readily verified that he spent up to 40 hours a week at his job.

"He comes home from work at about three o'clock," she said, "and goes down to the arena and doesn't get back until 10."

Besides his official job as secretary he is also statistician for the league.

Have you applied for your Social Insurance Number?

Your government is issuing Social Insurance Number Cards in place of the unemployment insurance numbers that most employed people have had until now. The new numbers will help government to use modern office methods for greater efficiency in handling unemployment insurance, and also other social benefits such as proposed pension plans.

For these reasons, you are invited to apply for a Social Insurance Number, even if you are not a contributor to the unemployment insurance plan.

If you haven't yet applied, here's what you do.

IF YOU ARE AN EMPLOYEE your employer will give you an application form. Fill it out and return to your employer promptly.

IF YOU ARE UNEMPLOYED and drawing benefit you will complete an application form when you report to the Unemployment Insurance Commission in person or by mail.

IF YOU ARE AN EMPLOYER registered with the Commission, you will receive application forms automatically. If NOT registered with the Commission, please get in touch with your local U.I.C. office and application forms will be sent to you. Distribute application forms to your employees, have them completed and return them together, not individually, to the Commission.
