Black Cherry Whip Makes 10 Servings

113 cups evaporated milk 1 (15-nz.) can Canada Choice Sweet Bing

Cherries. (3-or) package black cherry jelly powder 4 cup dry sherry or orange juice tablespoon lemon juice

This recipe prepared sapecially for this series by Dairy Foods Service Bureau.

Freeze evaporated milk in treezer tray until cyretals form around edge of tray. Halve and pit drained oberries, reserving juice. Hest

juice to boiling point and jelly powder; sur until dissolved. Stir in remaining in gredients; cook slightly. Stir all but 10 cherry balves into jelly and chill until softly bet. Fold stiff-whipped chilled evaporated milk into gelstine mixture. Spoon into sherbels, garnish with remaining cherry halves, chill until set. (about 3 hours.)
