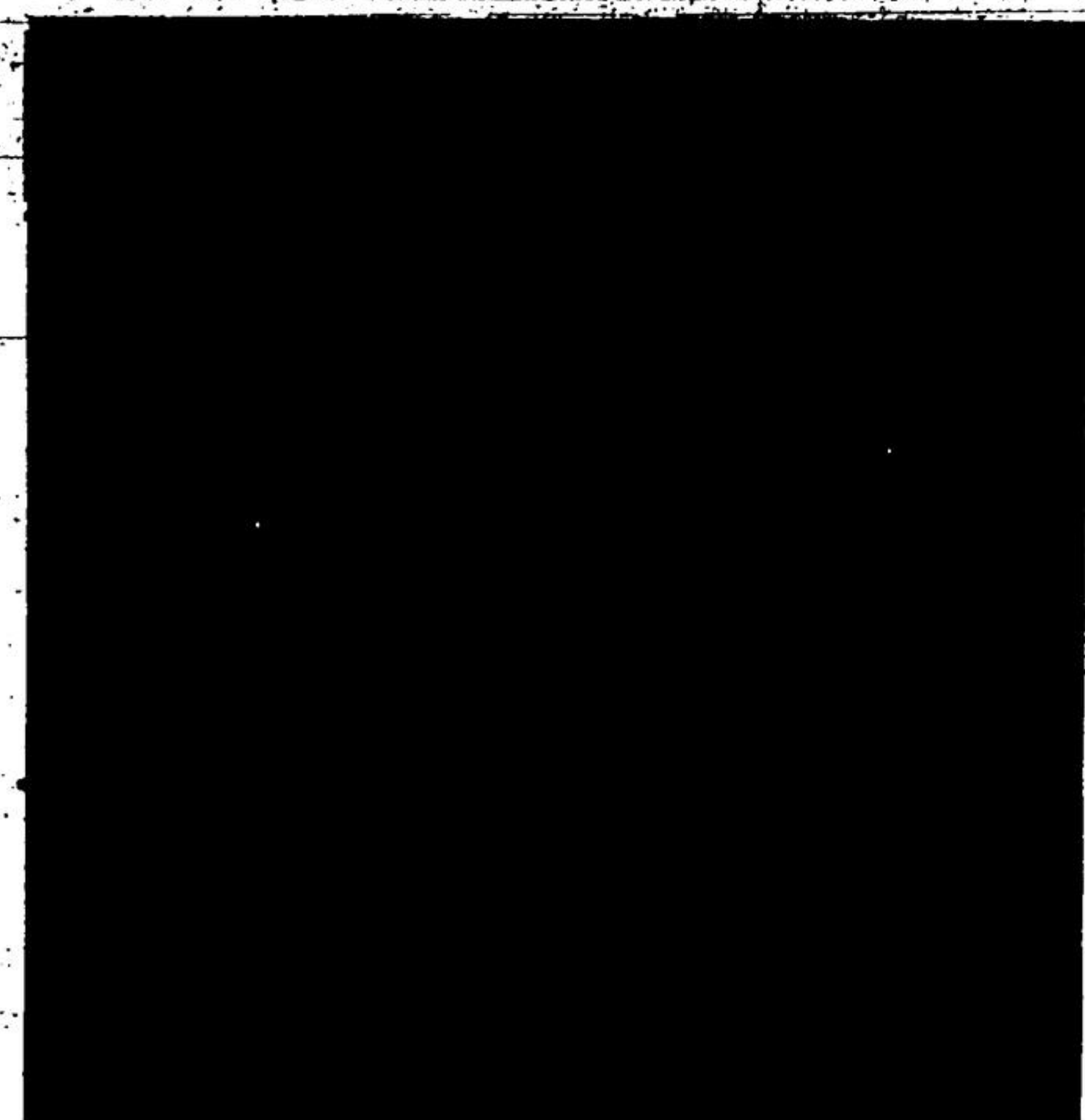
A dance to Currie's orchestra from Arion ended the evening on a lively note.

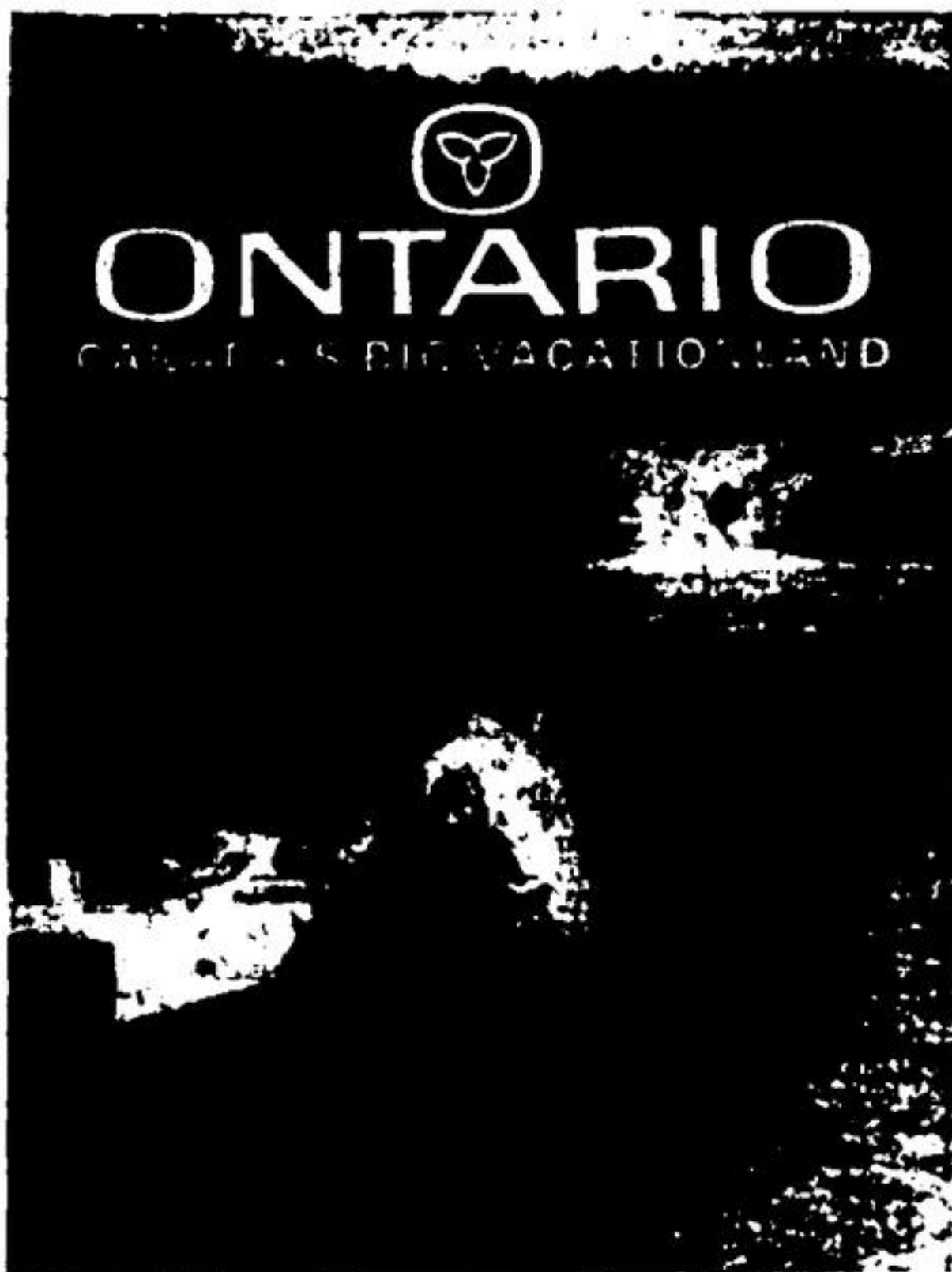

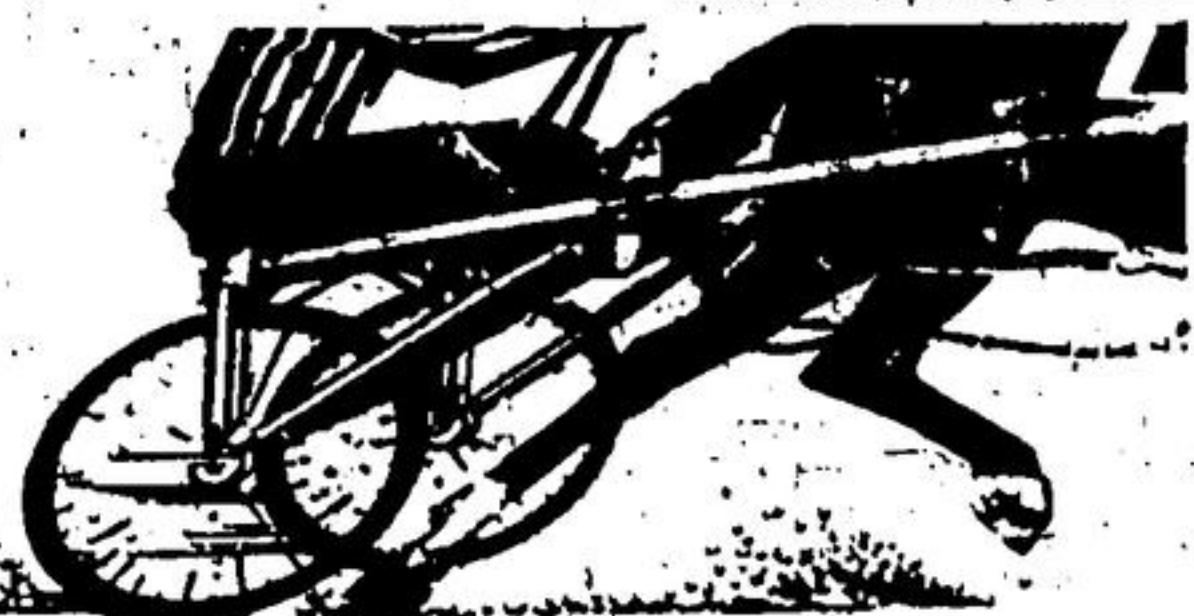
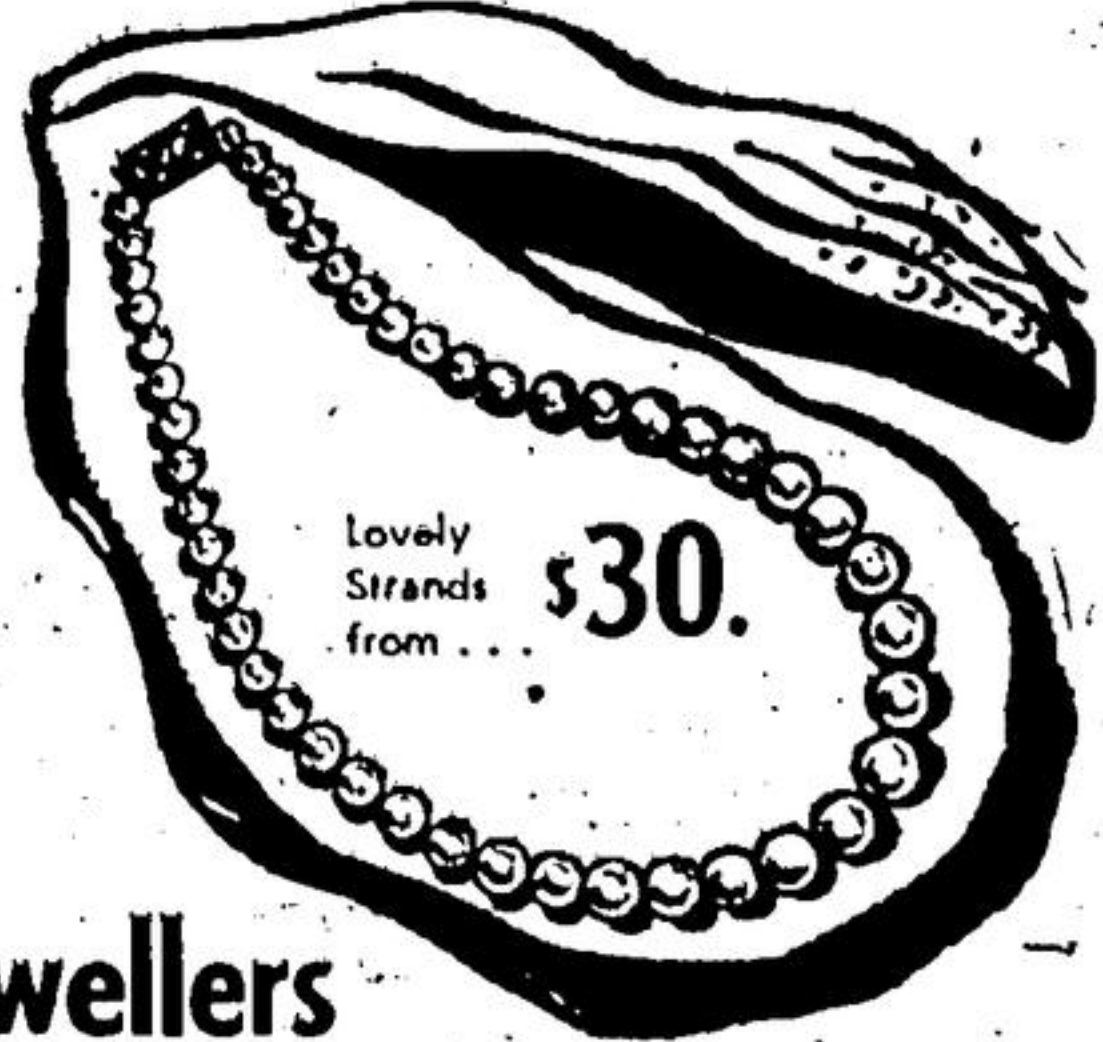
