

Ball Schedule Starts Monday - Giants Set

Four Individual Championships Spark High School Track Win

Outperforming competing athletes from Milton, Acton and Erin, Georgetown track and field team took the CWOSSA District 5 track and field meet in Guelph Tuesday, May 5th.

Two boys' championships, Junior and Senior were won by Bill McKeown with 18 points and Jeff Nurse with 22 points while the Bantam and Intermediate titles went to Acton athletes, Walker with 11 points and Hall and Goy with 15 points.

Georgetown girls Jill Kennedy and Betty Quackenbush took the Junior and Senior crowns with point totals of 15 and 33 respectively. The Bantam girls title went to Wa'dle of Milton with 10 and the Intermediate championship to Carnoy of Milton with 30 points.

The Georgetown total was 222. Milton was second with 148, Acton third with 137 and Erin fourth with 102.
