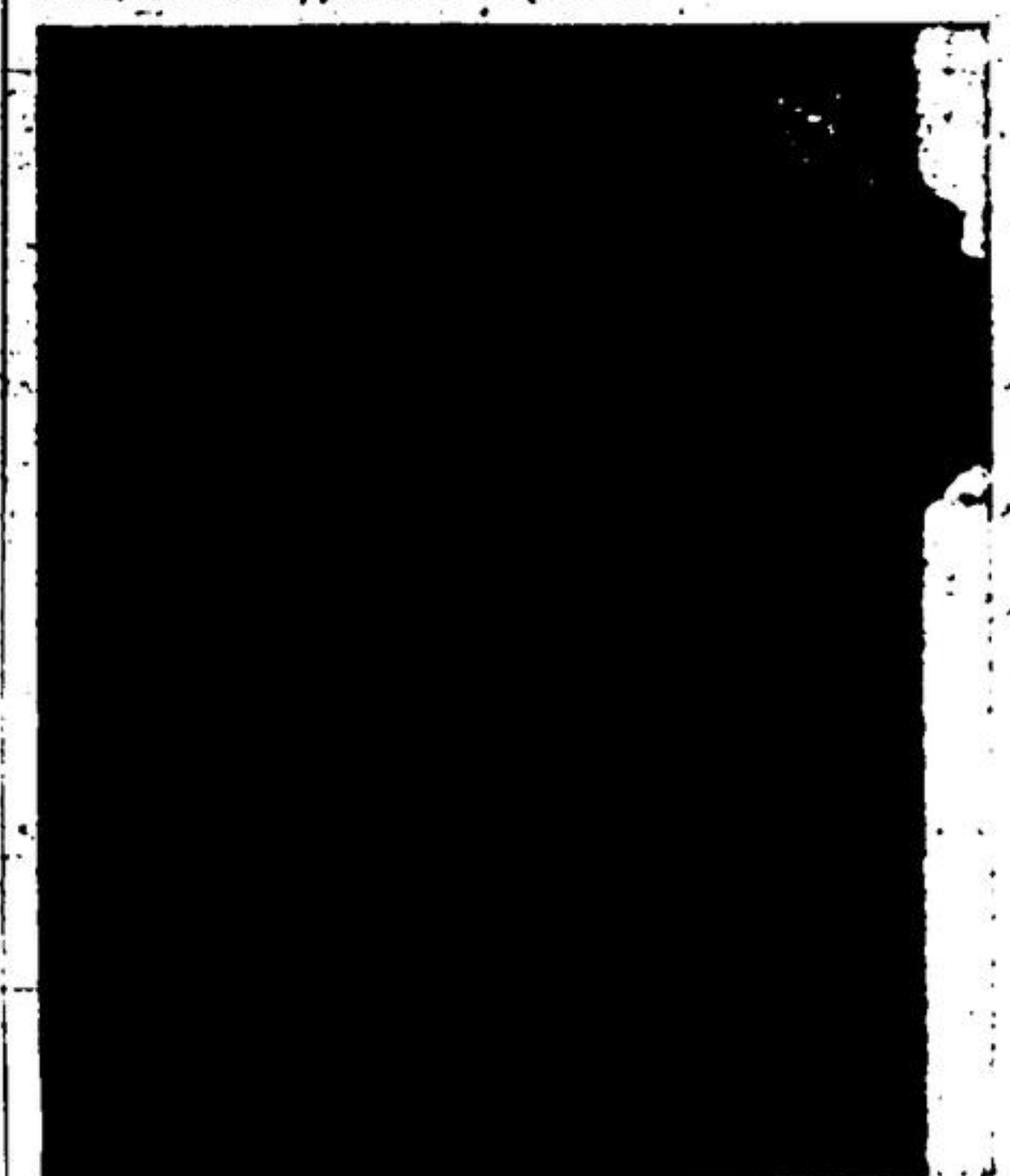
welcomed hockey club members and explained that the Legion was proud of their accomplishment since the majority had learned the game in Legion sponsored Saturday Morning Hockey.

Beavs Watch the Pros Then Beat Beach Club

Last Sunday, Georgetown Beavers put on a first class exhibition of precision passing to hand the highly touted Balm Beach side an 11-0 setback at Toronto's High Park. The Toronto team, which toured Britain last fall, is a well known senior league club and the local squad can be justifiably proud of the result.

The fact that most of the Beavers attended the Scotland vs. Ontario match the previous day at Varsity stadium, probably has a lot to do with their success. It was the first time that many of the Canadian-born members of the Beavers had watched a championship team in action and they used what they learned with great effect against Balm Beach.
