Seven Hours Over Limit Pupil Will Miss a Year

A parent whose son is just seven hours over the December 31 deadline for Kindergarten Primary enrollment next term lost a plea to have the boy start school in September at a public school board meeting Wednesday.

Board members sympathetic to the woman who asked the trustees to stretch the deadline slightly, but a show of hands revealed the majority in favour of holding to the line. The boy will be five years old at 7 a.m. January 1, 1965.

"I feel we have to draw the line somewhere," said trustee Malcolm Yreeman. "The 31st is the deadline across the province and we should stick to it here."

"If we extended it for one where would we stop," said trustee Ed Wilson. "If someone a few hours over the limit were admitted then we would be sure to get a request from someone with a child a day over and then two days over."

"Fortunately we have several extension classes so a child to gain a year at the start may gain it back by the time he or she reaches grade eight," chairman Stan Finlay said.
