Domtar Mill Will Play In Acton Softball Loop

At a special meeting Sunday Acton Softball Association accepted an entry from Georgetown to fill the vacancy in the six team league left by the UPWA Turners, who failed to renew their franchise.

Two representatives from Domtar paper mill attended the meeting, chaired by Ted Pope, who explained the constitution rules and regulations of the Acton league. Official acceptance by Domtar representatives was delayed until Monday when they informed Mr. Pope they would definitely enter the league.

Past President Dave Manes explained to the Domtar representatives their entry could only be renewed on a year to year basis. In the event a local sponsor fields a team next season, Domtar would be obliged to sit out until another vacancy exists.

The Domtar club was accepted with the understanding their players must work in the

paper mill. Any other players they recruit must come from a seven mile radius of Acton, a rule the rest of the circuit's teams must also observe. An exception was made for one player who has been pitching for Domtar in the Georgetown Industrial League.
