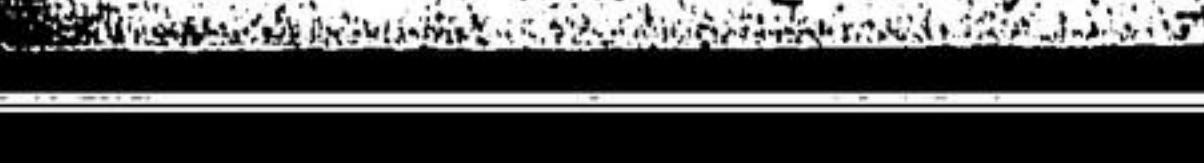

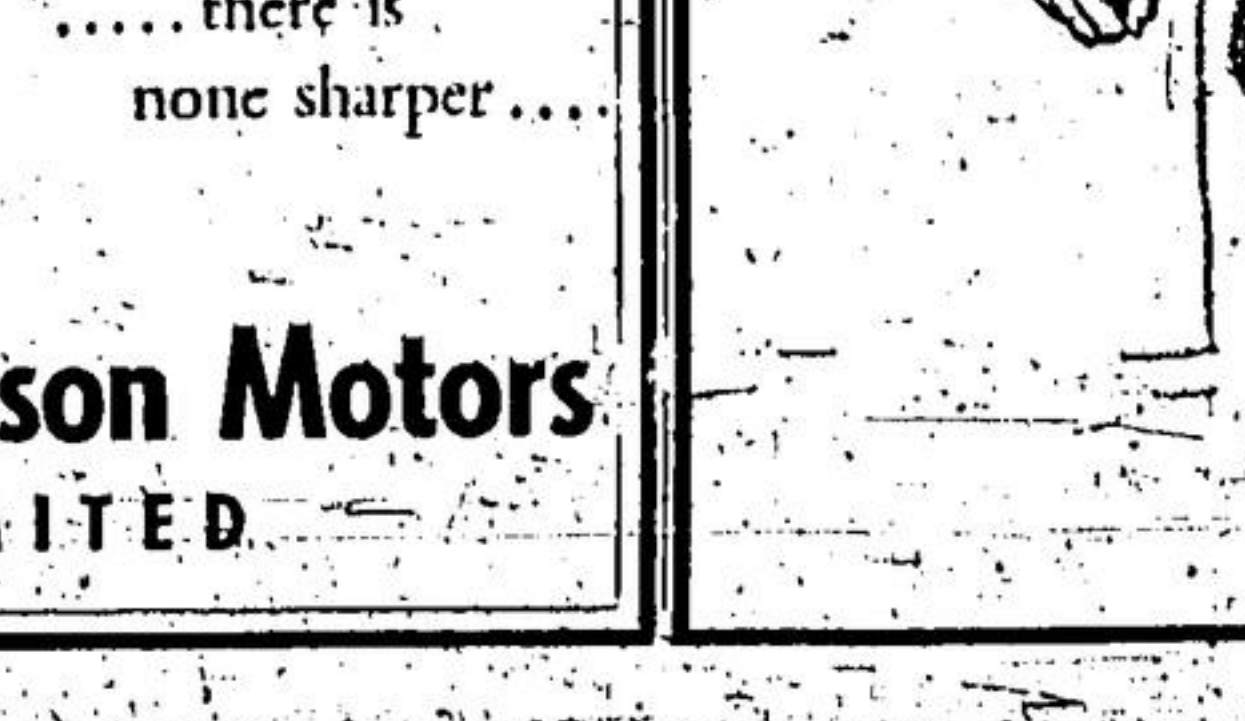

## Water Dept. in the Red Debentures are Answer

A "floating indebtedness" debenture over a three-year period to pay off an accumulated deficit in the town water department will be issued this year. The move was ordered by the Dept. of Municipal Affairs when the 1963 financial statement was viewed by the department.

A motion to issue the debentures was delayed a week Monday when Deputy Reeve Hunter suggested that council discuss this with the town auditor before making a move.

"This debt occurred over a period of years and I can't understand why the department says this must be done this year," he said. "Why can't the deficit be made up from the general tax rate?"

Water chairman Powers said the auditor had pointed out the deficit in his report, but the year-end deficit was actually \$5,000 less than it had been at the end of 1962.

The next meeting in June will be at the home of Mrs. Denney (Charles) a Pot Luck Supper, the guest speaker being Mrs. Sam Mackenzie.

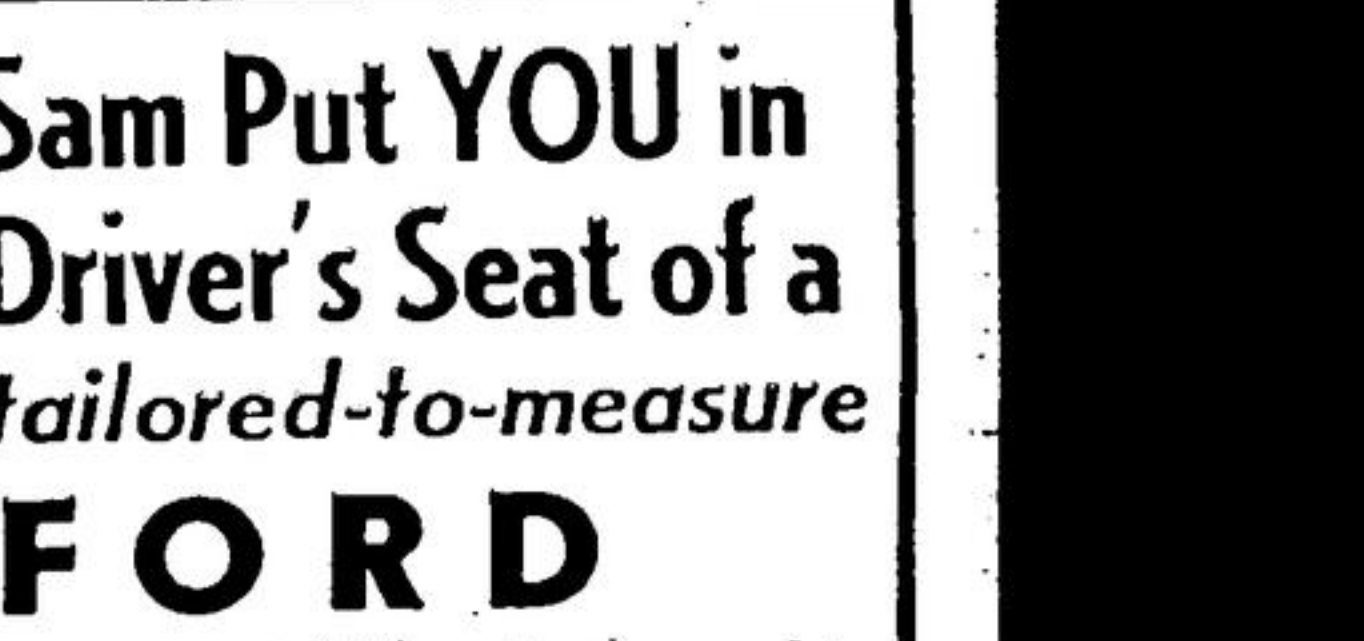
