Home Weaving Popular Hobby For Local Ladies

The rhythmic rattle of a loom - the ceaseless trip back and forth of a shuttle - and a woman sitting peacefully at home creating a shawl, a scarf or dress lengths. Sounds like a picture from another century, or an ad for Pioneer Village, however it is happening right here in Georgetown.

Neither are the women running the looms replicas of Whistler's Mother; they are young women who are combining a hobby with an at-home money making project.

Mrs. D. Wood, Mrs. W. Hayward and Mrs. Frank Coldest are three of the women who weave for Kirk Kraft, turning out the beautiful hand made articles which are so much in demand in this machine age.

The women receive a warp (a big, long skein of fine yarn) from Mrs. Moyer of Kirk Kraft and then they put it on the loom. After threading the yarn through a forest of heddles (something like sewing machine needles) they are ready to go.
