Civic Auditorium, Culture Centre Among Centennial Possibilities

Initial discussions which could lead to a major recreation area for Georgetown were discussed Tuesday night at a meeting called by Mayor Gibbons. The project would mark Canada's centennial in 1967.

Government grants to a maximum of \$2.00 per capita are available for an approved project, providing the town puts up a one-third share.

While a recreation centre seemed to have majority approval of the dozen people attending the meeting, such things as an indoor swimming pool, a civic auditorium, a second park and a cultural centre were discussed.

Cr. Bill Smith was named chairman of a tentative committee with Reeve John Elliott and Eric Halkind as initial members.

Another meeting is planned next Tuesday, with the committee to report on availability of land and the possibility of making the project a joint one with Esqueping Township.
