Past President Ron Hill reviewed last year's accomplishments, and recalled the milestone of being chosen for the Drama Festival, and of merging with a trophy he hoped

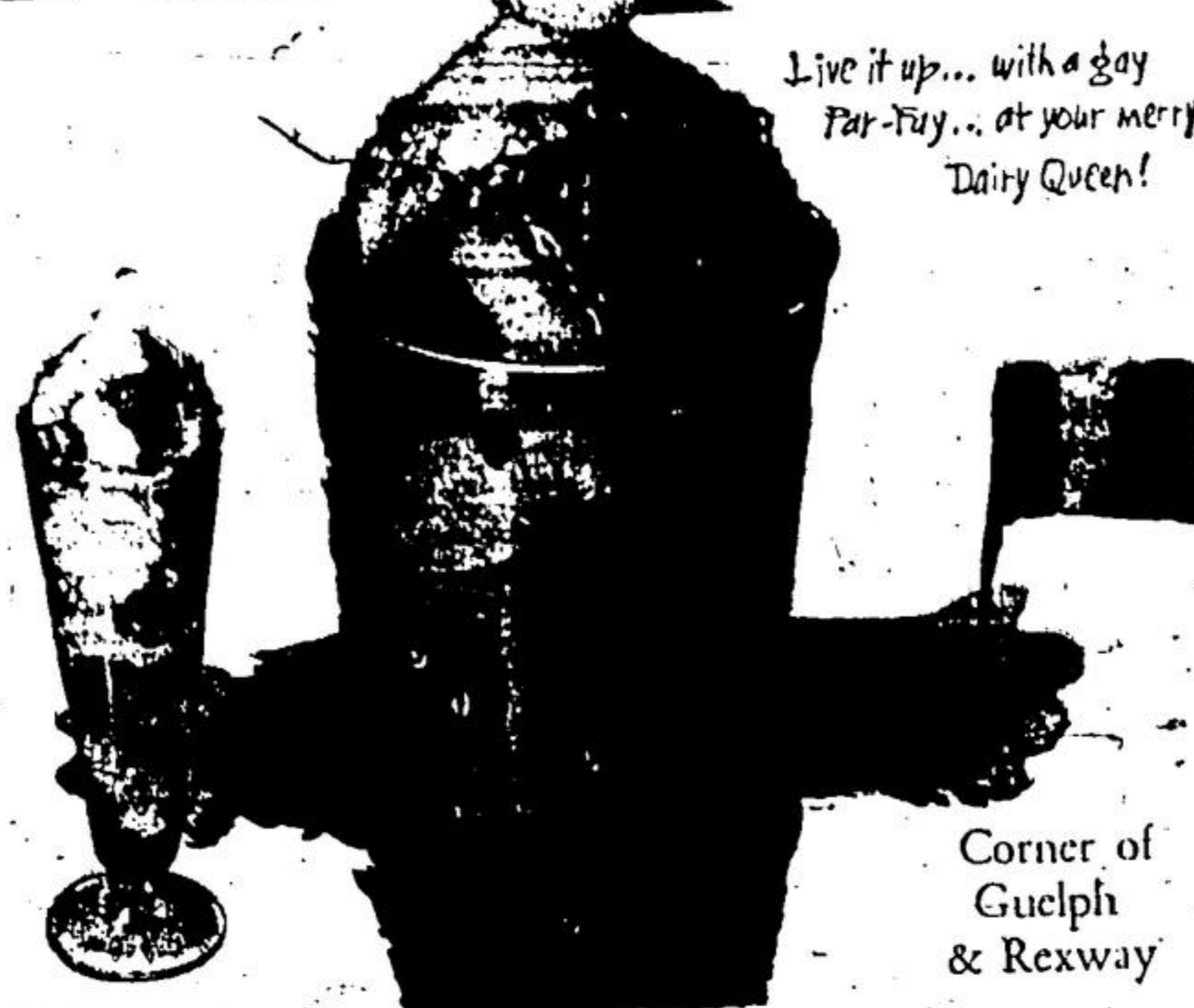
